Multnomah Club To Begin Rehearsals

Club Will Start Things To Make Its
Amateur Theatrical Show at Kelling
Big Success.

Rehearsals for the theatrical performance, "Colonial Beaux and Belles in Dixie Land," to be staged by the Multnomah Theatre of December 14 and 15 by the Multnomah Amateur Athletic club will commence Tuesday evening in the club's gymnasium. This is the first entertainment effort of this nature staged by the club since the famous Society Circus staged by the combined members of the Multnomah club and Portland Hunt club in June, 1910. Probably 100 will be in the cast.

The applications for places in the cast are coming in very rapidly, and the first selection of performers will be made by William Broad, who has been engaged as director, next Tuesday night.

The action of the plot is laid in Florida, and the brilliant costuming and special scenery will be in keeping with the scenes of that section. There will be much tuneful music and singing and dancing.

A souvenir program containing a history of the club since its establishment in 1894 will be distributed at the performance. The primary object in staging the theatrical is to raise money for building two new handball courts.

Found Guilty of Cheating Innkeeper

Sentence Is Suspended In Case of E.
Newcomb, Providing Letter Make a
Settlement of Claim.

"This is the first absolutely good case brought in my court under the statute defining the offense of inn-keeping," said District Judge Jones yesterday in finding E. Newcomb guilty of the charge. Sentence was suspended prevailing Newcomb \$10 and give a note for \$23.80 to the Hotel Benson, the complainant in the case.

Testimony for the hotel was to the effect that Newcomb had been with him a few dollars in his pocket. He ran up a bill of \$33.80 and borrowed \$20. Judge Jones said that the money borrowed could not be considered as it was a civil matter. Newcomb excused his acts by saying he went to the hotel with a sick friend, and for that reason did not want to go to a place more in keeping with his circumstances.
