THEATRICAL NEWS

Rupert Harvey Delivers Talk on the Drama at Heilig Yesterday.
 Ibsen Not Understood.
 An audience of pleasing size and quality assembled at the Heilig yesterday afternoon on the invitation of the Drama League to hear Rupert Harvey, leading man of the "Milestones" company, speak on the drama with especial reference to Ibsen. Mr. Harvey said by way of introduction that it had been his observation that the man on the street, as it were, refused to go to the theatre and see those dramatic offerings that would educate him and make him think, hence the prevalence of melodrama and cheap drama.

Speaking of England, Mr. Harvey said that Ibsen's plays were not understood. He contended that people had insisted upon reading inner meanings beneath every line and making the text obscure and difficult. Cases in point were "Peer Gynt" and "Little Eyolf" which Mr. Harvey said were fairy tales and the man who attempted to explain a fairy tale was worse than foolish.

Mr. Harvey said that although modern dramatists were just beginning to use the piling up of minute details to make the plot more interesting, the master of that secret 50 years ago had used it continually. Mr. Harvey said that due to the difficulty of the drama because his plays were translations from his original writings, he said that Ibsen should not be looked upon as a dead Norseman but as a very much alive writer of today.

Mr. Harvey read three scenes from "Emperor and Galliwag" illustrating Ibsen's dramatic effect, his style and diction and his literary excellence. Mr. Harvey was introduced by Frank Riley, treasurer of the Drama League, who spoke some words on the purposes of the league and its work.

Good Bill at Empress.
 The Empress has a bill that does not read well on the program but plays surprisingly well on the stage. All acts, but the first turn, are musical and very different. The bill is opened with Polzin Brothers, European acrobats, that have several good feats. They are followed by Thomas Patricia and Ruby Meyer. Miss Meyer is a dandy little singer and dancer. Some of their comedy is not especially strengthening to the act, but it is very good.

The next act is a song and gown revue by Blanche Leslie, who wears some beautiful creations and was well received. She is followed by Earl Wheeler and Yare Cuts in "The Girl and the Drummer," an act that is a pleasant surprise all the way through. It has many little unexpected turns, and is very pretty and is thoroughly enjoyable.
