

FUNERAL OF HUSBAND IS ABRUPTLY HALTED BY DEATH OF WIFE

Mrs. Charles E. Wicklund, Overcome by Grief, Passes Away Sunday Morning.

Arrangements for the funeral of Charles E. Wicklund came to an abrupt stop two hours before the services were to begin yesterday when it became known that the wife, Mrs. Mary Wicklund, stricken by grief, had passed away. When Mr. Wicklund died Friday after a long illness, Mrs. Wicklund was so overcome that she took to her bed. The 29 years of married life had drawn them so closely together that the wife could not bear to see her husband in death.

Wednesday at 2 o'clock funeral services for the couple will be held in Skewes' undertaking parlors and the bodies will be placed in the same grave in Rose City Park cemetery.

Mrs. Wicklund had been ill for some time, though none of her friends thought her condition serious. When Mr. Wicklund died, however, she was so affected that she would not consent to look upon her husband. Mr. Skewes accordingly took the body to his undertaking establishment and prepared it for burial, arranging with the Woodmen of the World for the funeral, which was to have been held at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

"Believing that after her first grief had subsided, she would want to see how her husband looked," said Mr. Skewes today, "I had the body taken from the casket and placed on a sofa, where I had it photographed. I called at the house yesterday morning, intending to tell her what I had done and a neighbor came to the door and told me she, too, had passed away."

Mr. Wicklund was 55 years old and his wife was 58. He was born in Sweden and she in France. Immediately after their marriage 30 years ago they came to the United States, proceeding almost directly to Oregon. They had no children of their own. Mr. Wicklund was active in Woodcraft and formerly was associated with Webfoot camp. Of late years he had been infirm and was able to work but little, the Woodmen giving considerable assistance. They owned a little home at 951 East Twenty-fourth street north.

Slain Deputy Game Warden Blameless

State Game Warden William L. Finley Declares Report From Gold Beach Does Dead Official Great Injustice.

Calling attention to a story published Saturday from Gold Beach to the effect that it was reported that Deputy Game Warden W. S. Hubbard, who was shot and killed Thursday by Lois Martin, had once lured Martin to violate the game laws and had then arrested him, State Game Warden William L. Finley says that the story is not true and does the dead deputy an injustice. The report was offered as a probable provocation for Martin's deed.

"Such reports have been circulated at times," said Mr. Finley, "but were not true in the case of Hubbard, whom I knew personally, and who was one of our best men, particularly in that he used good common sense in enforcing the laws. It is strictly against the rules of the department that a deputy deliberately allow a man to violate the game laws and then arrest him."

"Prompt dismissal from the service is the penalty for such action, and the deputies are warned of this when they enter the service. Hubbard was a conscientious, straightforward man and official, and I am certain that any report reflecting on his integrity as a man or an official is without foundation."

Commissioners Can Reduce Salaries

City Attorney Upholds Deck in Cutting Pay to Two Municipal Engineers. Council Only Can Raise.

The city commissioners can reduce the salaries of any employees in their respective departments whenever they see fit without orders from the council, according to an opinion rendered by City Attorney La Roche Saturday. This means that W. S. Chapman and J. G. Garrow, two municipal engineers in the department of public works are to have their salaries reduced in accordance with the direction of Commissioner Deck.

Commissioner Deck contends that the salaries of these men were excessive and arbitrarily reduced them. His right to do this was questioned, and City Auditor Barber put the matter up to City Attorney La Roche, who, La Roche says, however, that in raising salaries the power rests entirely with the city council and can not be done without instructions by that body.

Disaster Foreseen In Continued War

If Neutral Nations Do Not Use All Power to Stop Bloodshed They Are Equally Guilty With Combatants.

Declaring that war is murder of the first degree, Dr. Nina Evaline Wood, head of the Volunteer Peace society, presided at the peace meeting at the Central library yesterday afternoon that, unless warfare is permanently stopped the "death penalty in a higher scope which overhangs the world" will not be commuted.

She declared that if the people of the neutral nations do not do all in their power to bring about peace they must share the guilt of the combatants.
