**THAW IS DESPERATE OVER HIS CASE SAYS WOMAN INTERVIEWER**

He Receives Her, Entertains Her, but Is Silent on Question of His Plans.

**"VISIBLE, NOT AUDIBLE"**

Interviewer Stays for Luncheon, and They Discuss War and the Seed Campaign, but Not Harry's Case.

Manchester, N. H., Dec. 29.—Harry Thaw was nervous and gravely mute regarding his case today. A newspaper writer whom he knew he had to luncheon at his prison home and presented to his mother, who was visiting him.

"I am visible, but not audible," he said to the reporter. He performed his duties as host in silence, save for praise of the waffles and honey which he ate with enjoyment. He left his guest for a few moments to attend the furnace. Always in his wake, like two shadows, were his jailers, Sheriff Drew and Deputy Sheriff Stevens.

Mrs. William Thaw, who arrived from Pittsburgh on Christmas day to spend the holidays with her unfortunate son, sat in the sunshine flooded sitting room of the white mansion at No. 2146 Elm street, knitting a stocking.

Knitting for Soldiers.

"It will find its way sooner or later, I suppose, to the scene of war," she said.

On the lounge and on the small table in the corner were packages wrapped in gay red ribbon still unopened.

"They are Harry's," said the silver-haired woman, outwardly so serene and inwardly in a tumult of anxiety for the tall man with the restless eyes, the yellow face and the brown hair turning gray in the tufts above the ears and about the temples.

Harry Thaw sat down at the piano and brilliantly dashed off a few bars, then tired of them before he had finished and wandered about his prison home posing for photographs.

Not the Time to Speak.

"It isn't the time to speak," he said with a restless glance, tapping his lip with his forefinger and smiling his quick and quick vanishing smile. Never far beyond eye range of the pair of men who are his sleepless keepers, Sheriff Drew, fat, benevolent with a fiery temper, Sheriff Stevens is cast in harder mould. He is one of the grim gray men that only New England produces, men with sharp eyes that would send a bullet straight to its target.

It is an ordeal that raps the nerves to be ever under espionage. Miss Cox, who is Mrs. Thaw's companion, sat between the jailers at lunch and looked restless.

Talks of Seed Campaign.

Secretary Rice, a handsome young chap, to whom dancing would seem more natural, sat smiling midway of the board.

Mrs. Thaw, prompted by her son, talked of the seed campaign during the time of drought in Alaska 19 years ago, and her part in it. Hospitality was there. There could be no question of that, but a deep and terrible anxiety dominated it.

Must the nervous man with the restless eyes return to the hospital? Was the decision of the supreme court, as his attorney had said, final? Was there no hope? The state that in wit-out hope is desperation. Desperate minds breed desperate deeds. Is Harry Thaw planning as he talks absent? What is the silver crowned mother facing in the new year?

**Nehalem Fishermen Want Open Season**

First Steps Toward Request for Legislation Next Year Taken at Recent Meeting of Interests Affected.

Nehalem, Or., Dec. 29.—A meeting of the fishermen of Nehalem Bay was held here to formulate a plan to have the closed season on salmon removed. At present the 20 days from November 20 to December 10 are closed for fishing in the river and bay. No other part of the county is similarly affected. Tillamook Bay has no closed season and the fishermen there have this part of the season of fishing more than the local men. Emil Larson, president of the association, was appointed to take the matter up with Representative T. B. Handley with the idea of having a bill placed before the legislature to relieve the situation.

Not only are the fishermen injured by the closed season, but the best part of the fishing time comes just when the men cannot place their nets on the river. Business men of the valley are working with the fishermen in getting their early support. A strong resolution will be sent to the legislature asking that the relief be granted.

The fishermen on the river are forced to go to considerable expense for their gear; in fact, much more than those on Tillamook Bay, and they have been unable to clear themselves with the canneries or pay for their nets during the last six seasons.

With 20 days taken out in the best part of the season, the fishermen here are greatly handicapped. They say they cannot see why they should be forced to stop during a closed season when the fishermen on other waters of the county do not have to.

**Industrial Y. M. C. A. Is Commended**

Such improvement has been noted in the general conditions in logging camps through the northwest since the advent of the Industrial Young Men's Christian association that the Washington bureau of labor statistics and factory inspection, in its last biennial report, has commended the work and suggested that it should be given state and official encouragement.

J. D. Goodell of Portland is in charge of the industrial work throughout the northwest and the efforts of his department, the report says: "The entrance of the industrial department of the Y. M. C. A. into the logging camps is promoting considerably their constant improvement, and in more ways, too, than the merely physical, and such an influence should be stimulated rather than hindered. The Y. M. C. A. is now established in good buildings in the camps at Doty, Kelsey and Firdale, Wash., and is steadily reaching out to others."
