VANCOUVER INTEREST IN APPROPRIATION IS URGED BY GOVERNOR

State Schools for Deaf and Blind May Get New Buildings Soon.

Vancouver, Wash., Jan. 22.—Appropriations, aggregating \$246,200 for the state schools for the deaf and blind, which are located in Vancouver, have been recommended to the state legislature by Governor Lister. This amount includes the sum of \$100,000 for two new buildings, one for the school for the deaf and one for the school for the blind.

The recommended appropriation for the school for the deaf is \$125,000, divided as follows: Maintenance, \$84,000; repairs and improvements, \$35,000; traveling expenses of students to Gallaudet college, Washington, D. C., \$15,000; library, \$2,000; and new school building and furnishings, \$14,000. The recommended appropriation for the school for the blind aggregates \$107,000 and is divided as follows: Maintenance, \$45,000; manual training supplies, \$15,000; \$10,000 for summer school for adults; \$3,000; repairs and improvements, \$1,000; new school and administration buildings and furnishings, \$6,000.

The 1915 appropriations of the legislature, which did not include appropriations for new buildings, amounted to \$147,085, of which \$87,263 was for the school for the deaf and \$59,822 was for the school for the blind.

Vancouver in Brief.

Vancouver, Wash., Jan. 22.—Petty thefts in various parts of the city are becoming a common occurrence and twice during the past month the home of Amelia Thiedemann, on West Twenty-ninth street, has been visited. During the week between Christmas and New Year's somebody made away with a canary and yesterday somebody took the family supply of milk shortly after it had been left by the milkman. Similar thefts are being reported in other sections of the city.

Bond in the sum of \$1618.68, alleged to be due on a promissory note. Attorney fees of \$200 and costs and disbursements are also asked.

Arguments in the damage suit of Thomas Jenny against William McColl, Washougal parties, were heard in the superior court this morning. Plaintiff seeks to recover in the aggregate sum of \$1467.65 for injuries alleged to have been received at the hands of the defendant.

Milwaukie Plans Billboard Measure

Ordinance Provides That Licenses Must Be Taken Out; Penalties for Violations of Same.

Milwaukie, Or., Jan. 22.—A city ordinance has been read and posted providing for licensing, regulating and restraining bill posting, sign and bulletin painting and distributing circulars, advertising matter or samples of similar business and providing penalties for violations of its provisions.

For these business operations, the ordinance requires that a license must be obtained from the city recorder, the fee to be \$10 per year in advance and no license to be granted for less than a year. Licensing is not required of theatres or amusements or entertainments given by churches, charitable or fraternal organizations or of local meetings. Penalties for violations of the ordinance are provided for in the ordinance.

The ordinance provides that "no person shall post, place, or cause to be posted, on any public place, any sign, notice, advertisement, or other matter, without first obtaining a license from the city recorder. Any person who violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction fined not less than \$5 nor more than \$50. Some opposition to the ordinance is being made, but it is expected to be passed by the city council.

The ordinance carries an emergency clause, providing that it shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

The ordinance also provides that "no person shall post, place, or cause to be posted, on any public place, any sign, notice, advertisement, or other matter, without first obtaining a license from the city recorder. Any person who violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction fined not less than \$5 nor more than \$50. 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CHURCHES HAVE NOT HELPED RELIEF WORK TO ANY GREAT EXTENT

Committee Somewhat Disappointed Because No More Interest Has Been Taken.

Oregon City, Or., Jan. 22.—With one exception, no cooperation has been given the committee working for the relief of poor and destitute families in Oregon City, by the churches of this city, according to the statement of Mrs. McDonald, chairman of the committee. Appeals have been made to the churches and some little help has been given by, principally the Sunday schools, but no concerted effort, such as the committee expected from organizations of the kind.

The one exception has been the Congregational church, and yesterday Rev. George Nelson Edwards offered to turn over the money in the charity fund to the cooperative relief committee and to do all in his power to raise more money among the members of his church.

Charity work among the needy families has come to such a point that money is needed, and needed badly, and unless sufficient is subscribed each week to meet the necessary expenses, the work will lapse and the 50 some-odd families will be left without the necessities of existence.

There is one family in need of a clearing house for anyone having an old stove, and will see that it reaches the house that needs it.

Headquarters of the relief committee is the Weinhart building which will be open until Saturday.

Oregon City Loses In Debate Race

Oregon City, Or., Jan. 22.—Oregon City was eliminated from the race for the state debating championship Thursday evening when the negative team composed of Otto Paul, Miss Beatrice Walton and Victor Braden defeated the Oregon City affirmative team composed of Edward Sheehan, Milton Miller and Mrs. Myrtle Young by a decision of two to one.

The question under discussion was "Government Ownership of Railroads." Joseph E. Hodges, of this city, was chairman of the judges, and Carlton E. Spencer, secretary of the University of Oregon Law school of Portland; Charles Romig, of this city and A. C. French, of the Portland Y. M. C. A. acted as scorers. Canemah Club Had Good Year

Oregon City, Jan. 22.—Started a year ago as more or less an experiment, the Canemah Rod and Gun club closed its first year last night, a strong and sufficiently wealthy organization to insure its perpetuation. The membership, which numbered 50 and there is a substantial balance in the treasury. During the year, bi-weekly shoots have been held and the interest, instead of lagging, is more pronounced than at first.

The new regime of officers elected last evening will attempt several things during the coming year. The shooting grounds, across the Willamette river from Canemah, will be improved, as will be the clubhouse. A supply of 5000 shells and 10 barrels of powder will be purchased and kept in stock at the clubhouse the year round. An effort will be made to get lights in front of the Canemah clubhouse, where all the business and social meetings are held.
