Slice \$12,000,000 Off Sundries Bill

Civil Bill as Reported to House Carries Appropriations \$5,000,000 Less Than That Passed Last Year. Washington, Feb. 5.—The sundry civil appropriation bill, as reported to the house yesterday showed a reduction of nearly \$5,000,000 from last year's expenditures, and nearly \$12,000,000 under the estimates submitted by the various departments. The bill carries a total of \$125,928,000, against \$130,728,000 last year.

Poincare Honors British Generals

While at the Front He Makes Two Grand Officers of Legion of Honor at Joffre's Request. Paris, Feb. 5.—President Poincare on his latest trip to the front, from which he returned today, in addition to presenting the colors to the regiments there and visiting Headquarters, went to the British headquarters, where he had a long conversation with Field Marshal Sir John French and the Prince of Wales and invested the British generals, Sir Douglas Haig and Smith-Dorrien, with the insignia of grand officers of the Legion of Honor. These were conferred at the special request of General Joffre, the French commander-in-chief.

Accompanied by the prefect of Arras, the mayor and every part of the ruined city and gazed for a long time at the chaos which everywhere met his eye. All about him were nothing but shapeless masses of stone and walls through which great holes had been torn by shells. In the midst of the ruins a small railroad has been built to take away the fallen blocks of stone from the streets.
