## PROMINENT POLOISTS ATTRACTED TO GREAT TOURNAMENT AT S. F.

Large Parties Coming From East, Not to Mention English Nobility.

## FOXHALL KEENE TO PLAY

Besides Polo There Will be the Golf Tournament and Harms, Meeting to Entertain Society.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 20.—The Universal Polo tournament, which is to be a very important feature of the Panama-Pacific Exposition at San Francisco, is attracting the attention of the smart world, not only in America and Canada, but word has been received by society folk in San Francisco that, contrary to expectations, quite a number of the English nobility will be in attendance at the exposition and at the polo tournament.

Already there are several of the prominent polo players in California, with others en route to leave for the west in order to be there in time for the opening of the tournament on March 15. There will be polo matches continuously every day for six weeks, the last match taking place on April 26. Three times a week the matches will be played at Exposition polo grounds, the most magnificent view of the Golden Gate, the green clad Marin Hills, the smiling waters of San Francisco Bay, while the present is the most ideal of gold and blue and orange of the Jewel City.

Twice a week there will be matches at El Cerrito field, near San Mateo. The San Mateo Polo club is the most famous of the smart set throughout the spring and summer seasons, being but a short ride from the city either by train or automobile. The members of the club are well as those of San Burlingame and Menlo Park Country clubs are planning all sorts of delightful entertainments for the visiting polo players and their friends, so that there will be no dearth of festivities for those of the fashionable world who come to the exposition from all parts of America, Europe and the Orient.

Foxhall Keene, the celebrated New York polo player, and his wife, and Rene La Montagne, the best polo player in the world, have announced their intentions of attending the exposition tournament, and both Keene and La Montagne, who have played in English fields, will take part in it.
