

BROTHER GIVES UP OWN SKIN SECOND TIME TO SAVE BOY

Grafting Process Resorted to Aid Recovery of Edwin Phillips, Severely Burned.

VICTIM IS 9 YEARS OLD

Fourth Skin Grafting Operation Undertaken Following Christmas Tree Fire at the Irvington School.

To put his younger brother on the road to recovery, Jack Phillips, 466 East Fourteenth street, yesterday, for the second time gave a number of inches of his skin to replace that of

his brother, Edwin, who was severely burned in the Irvington school Christmas tree fire, December 10, 1914. This was the fourth skin grafting operation on the boy. Edwin is only 9 years old and his brother, Jack, is 16 years old. Jack cheerfully gave some of his skin in the third operation and when it was seen that more skin was needed to patch the burned places on his brother, Jack again offered himself to the physicians. The operation was performed at the Good Samaritan hospital, and it is believed

that it will prove successful. Both boys are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. L. C. Phillips.
