

WILL THE GOVERNOR FAVOR POLITICIANS OR THE SPORTSMEN?

Selection of Eastern Oregon Member of Fish and Game Commission Is Issue.

ONLY TWO IN THE FIELD

Marion Jack and S. D. Crowe Are Candidates and Each Has Backing.

(Special to The Journal.) Pendleton, Or., April 9.—Whether the politicians or the sportsmen will be recognized in the naming of the eastern Oregon member of the new fish and game commission is a question, the answer of which will be interesting to the people of this section of the state.

Governor Withycombe will decide the matter within the few weeks and present indications are that he has an embarrassing problem on his hands. The endorsement of nearly every member of the senate has been secured for Marion Jack of this city for the position, while S. D. Crowe of La Grande has the support of the sportsmen's organizations of eight eastern Oregon counties, according to information received by the Umatilla Fish and Game association.

James Nichols, president of the Baker sportsmen's association, yesterday telegraphed to the governor, the withdrawal of his candidacy, recommending at the same time S. D. Crowe. Nichols' action united the sportsmen of Morrow, Umatilla, Union, Grant, Baker, Malheur and Harney counties and eliminated an element that was said to be militating in favor of Jack.

Jack was first recommended for the position by the Umatilla county legislators, or rather by three of them—Senator Burgess and Representatives Ritter and Starfield. Senator Everett has refused to support Jack, and has given his support to the La Grande man. Representative Hinkle had urged the appointment of Dr. H. S. Garfield of this city, but swung in line for Jack simultaneously with the dismissal of a case against himself and Garfield for shooting ducks after sundown, a case that had been pending for several months and during the pendency of which District Game Warden Averill lost his official head and was succeeded by Senator Burgess' private secretary, W. C. E. Pruitt. It was upon Pruitt's recommendation that the case against Hinkle and Garfield was dismissed.

Through the influence of the local legislators, the endorsement of nearly all of the members of the senate and a number of the representatives was secured for Jack, and reports here that the governor has favored Jack's appointment because the sportsmen were divided.

Now, however, the sportsmen have united on Crowe, and are openly opposing the appointment of the local man. This opposition arises from the fact that Jack, during the time the legislature was meeting, expressed

himself as out of sympathy with the commission form of administering game affairs.

Portland Lauded As Scenic Paradise

grocers of East and Middle West Sending Many Letters Asking About Excursion Trips.

Many inquiries are being received from grocers in the east and middle west, asking about Portland and short trips they may make therefrom, by Robert G. Duncan, editor of the Oregon Merchants' Magazine. In replying to the letters Mr. Duncan says he is able to recommend Portland as the center of a scenic paradise, but that he cannot do so with an enthusiastic commendation of the roads over which the various places of interest may be reached.

The National Retail Grocers' association holds its convention at San Francisco May 10 to 17, and many of the delegates will stop in Portland, either going or coming. The local association is making arrangements to entertain them, probably by a trip over the Columbia river highway. A steamer trip up the river has been suggested but Mr. Duncan says that it is impracticable because of the lack of a big excursion steamer.

"What we need," said Mr. Duncan this morning, "is good roads, real good roads and lots of them. It will be with little joy that I show the visiting grocers the magnificent panorama from Council Crest, knowing that there are only a few miles of good roads outside of the city limits."

U. S. Wants Glavis To Fork Over \$331

Former Accuser of Richard A. Hallinger Once Paid Himself Expenses and Now Uncle Sam Starts Suit.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Cal., April 9.—Louis R. Glavis, who figured prominently in the dispute between Gifford Pinchot and Richard A. Hallinger when it was alleged that certain Alaskan lands were being seized by private interests, re-entered the limelight here today as defendant in a suit brought by the United States government to collect \$331, which it is charged Glavis paid

for his expenses when, as disbursing officer for the division of the northwest, he traveled from Seattle to Beverly, Mass., to lay before President Taft evidence in the Alaska land case.

Glavis is at present practicing law in San Francisco. It is believed he will conduct his own defense when the suit comes before United States Judge Van Fleet for trial next week.
