AN AUTOMOBILE CHIEF WITH TOURIST MACHINES SUSPECTED BY POLICE

Exchange of License Tags of Stolen Machines Reported to Avoid Capture.

Autos Are Stolen in Space of Five Days, and Authorities Are Hunting For Guilty Party.

The theft of five high powered automobiles in five days, the recovery of three of them with the license missing, leads the police to believe that one man is stealing the machines for joy riding purposes, and is switching license tags to avoid capture.

S. Benson's Winton seven passenger machine was stolen April 4 at Broad and Taylor streets. Last night Sergeant of Police Oelner found the machine at Park and Yamhill streets.

Dr. W. C. Spencer's machine, bearing license No. 13188, was stolen yesterday afternoon, and was found about midnight at the home of Mrs. J. H. Hill, of 821 Marshall street.

Dr. J. Allen Gilbert's automobile was stolen last night from the business district, and was found several hours later by Patrolman Teeters on the Macadam road, about 800 yards south of the rock crushed, at the west end of Sixth street.

While Guy T. Ketcheson, publisher of the Pacific News, was driving his automobile, which had been left standing in the street, was stolen. Mrs. Ketcheson heard the noise of the engine of his car, and, rushing to the door, saw it disappearing around the corner.
