Six Pitchers Used by Two Leaders and Pernoll Hard Hit in Eleventh Frame.

Two Newcomers Get Seven of the Eighteen Hits Made by the Portland Swatamiths.

San Francisco, Cal., May 7.—Messrs. Bates and Hillyard, a couple of new birds that McCredie has imported, slipped seven of the 18 hits off four San Francisco pitchers yesterday and their activity became so contagious that nothing else than a Beaver victory could result. It was the third consecutive win against the Seals, but this time it took 11 innings and the score was 7 to 4.

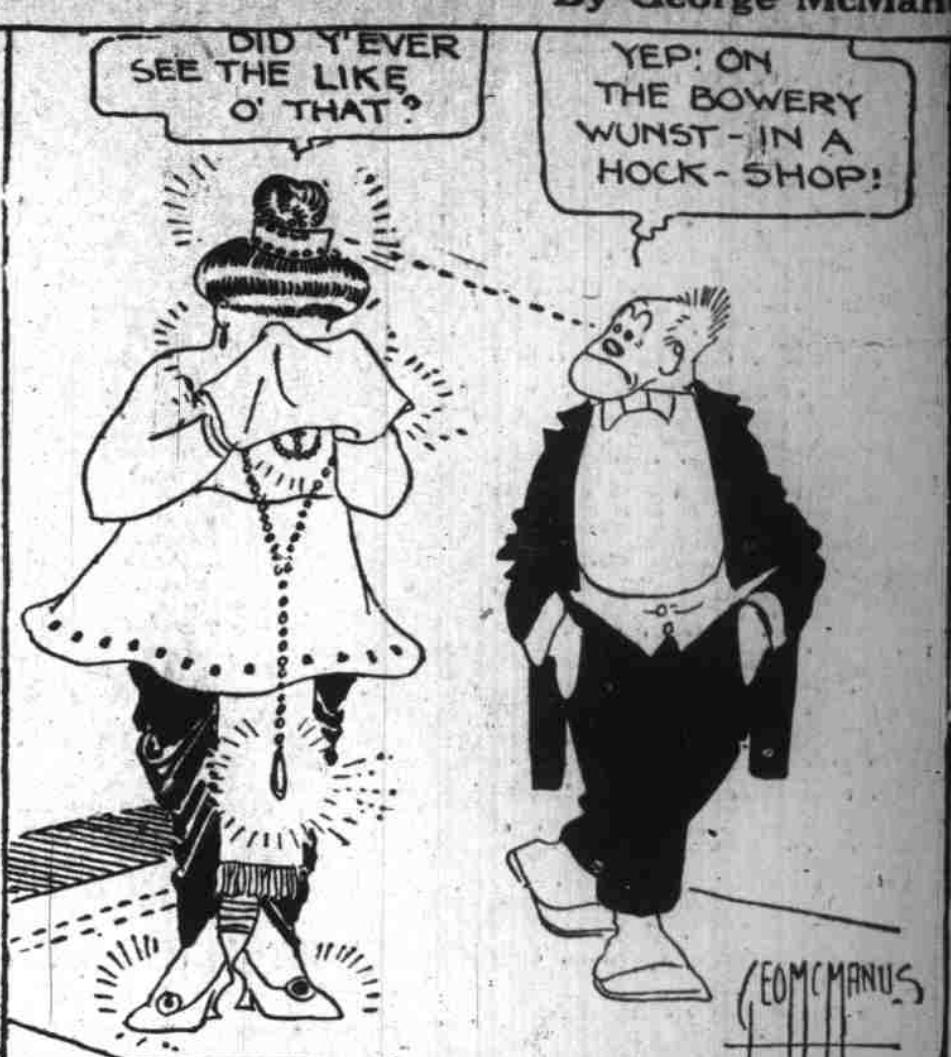

Harry Wolverton called upon Baum, Fanning, Karr and Pernoll and the latter was charged with the defeat. Coveloskie relieved Hig and held the lead over McCredie. McCredie decided to let Hig start the tenth after the score had been tied in the ninth, but one single was enough and Coveloskie was shot into the breach. The Pole stopped the Seals.

Portland got away in the lead in the second inning, when three runs were put over. Hillyard started out with a single and was followed with blows of the same calibre by Carisch and Lober, the latter's buff scoring Hillyard. Two sacrifice flies did the rest, Carisch scoring on Davis' long fly to Fitzgerald, and Lober coming up on Hig's sacrifice to Melan.

The fourth run was put over in the fifth, when Bates drove out a three-bagger and scored on Stump's infield out, Jones to Hellmann.

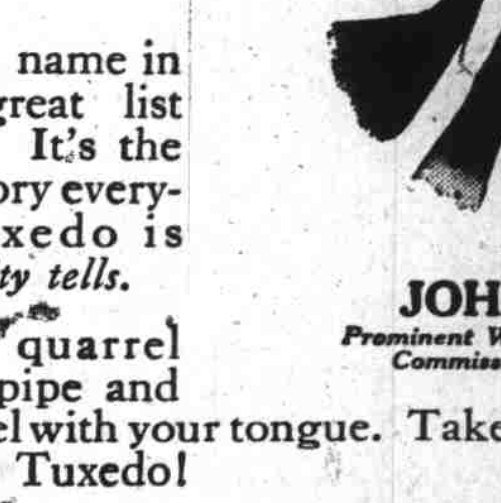
