

### UMATILLA COUNTY IS GOING RIGHT AFTER IMPROVED HIGHWAYS

Opening of the Cello Canal Makes Action Imperative for Prosperity of District.

Hermiston, Or., May 21.—Since the opening of the Cello canal, the necessity of more and better roads in the west end of Umatilla county is being realized more than ever before. Representatives of the towns of Echo, Stanfield, Hermiston and Umatilla met here May 18, and the following agreement was made for the new road course:

"It is hereby agreed by the members of the special committee appointed by the commercial clubs of Echo, Stanfield, Hermiston and Umatilla to select the route for the west end high-

way connecting the above named cities, in meeting at Hermiston, May 18, as follows:

"First—That the road shall run through the main streets of the four cities.

"Second—From Echo to Stanfield: Start at west end of Umatilla river bridge, thence following the present county road to northeast corner of Fred Andrews' place, thence due north to the south end of Main street in Stanfield, thence up Main street to Coe avenue, then west on Coe avenue over railroad crossing at depot to the present county road.

"Third—From Stanfield to Hermiston, commencing at intersection of county road and Coe avenue in Stanfield, thence along the present county road past the Peimulder place on road across the present overhead crossing to the east side of the government feed canal, then following the route of said canal to the telephone line, thence diagonally along the telephone line to the crossing of the feed canal above Hermiston, thence on the main county road as now constructed on Fourth street to Main street, thence on Main street to First street, thence north on First street to Ridgeway.

"The above route was adopted un-animously, with the understanding that it ultimately be reduced to a 4 per cent grade as near as practicable.

Fourth—From Umatilla to Hermis-

ton, starting at Main street in Umatilla, following up the river on the west side of the railroad right of way to and across the drainage cut to the first road crossing, thence across the track and thence along the east side of the railroad right of way to Hermiston, terminating at Ridgeway or the Baptist church.

Sixth—It is agreed that the Hermiston road district shall fulfill its obligation to the people in that the graveling of the north road as now constructed shall be completed to the Umatilla road district line.

### FEDERATED WOMEN LINE UP FORCES FOR HOT ELECTION FIGHT

Early Activities and Charges of Fraud Indicate Exciting Contest in Convention Hall

San Francisco, May 21.—(U. P.)—Excitement was at fever heat today among the delegates to the convention of the Federated Women's Clubs, in session at the Civic Auditorium, where the election of officers will be held and the so-called "anti-politics amendment" will be decided.

That the election will be warmly contested is not doubted. Sentiment is about equally divided between the candidacy of Mrs. A. F. Jones of the northern district, who represents the cities, and Mrs. Emily Hoppin of Yolo county, who seems to have lined up the delegates from the rural communities.

Rumors that a number of the delegates are not satisfied with the manner in which Mrs. Hoppin was nominated only served to cause the Hoppin adherents to work harder for the success of their candidate. Charges that some of the 28 names, signed to the nomination petition of Mrs. Hoppin, were fraudulent, have momentarily been lost sight of in the fight to extend the time of the registering of delegates, who have the right to ballot at today's election.

After a hot contest, in which both of the candidates spoke, standing side by side on the platform, hands clasped and vowing unalterable allegiance to

the cause of women, the time was extended until 11:30 today in order to allow late delegates a chance to register and get into the fray.

Not only will the election stir the delegates, but the anti-politics amendments are coming up for determination. That the amendments will be defeated and the clubwomen will reserve the right to engage in politics and hold political office seems to be assured, although a determined fight for the amendments will be made by a portion of the delegates.
