EASTERN EGGS PUT IN STORAGE HERE TO PUT TOTALS TO HIGH POINT

Eight Carloads From East of Rockies Reported Imported by Meat Company Because It Wanted to Hold Down Local Price.

Storage stocks of eggs here are today the most liberal ever known and the movement into the house markets is always kept to the contrary by affected interests.

Present offerings of eggs from the country are of the best quality that formerly, in fact handlers contended that quality is now the best of the season to date.

With the present heavy supply of local eggs in storage, it is figured by the trade that there is sufficient in house goods available for all wants of the trade until at least January 1, when the market is always kept to the less doubtful.

EGG MARKET HOLDS WELL Market for eggs is holding well along the street with sales generally at 12c for case count, although a few are reported to be asking a fraction above this. Some dealers are handling select quality at a fraction more.

BUTTER GOING INTO STORAGE With increased strength shown in the market, creamery interests are pushing into storage. Creamery interests are making no aggressive campaign to sell goods because the call for storage.

VEAL MARKET IS SLUMPING Fully another half cent has been cut in the price of veal at the local market, with extreme tops at 10 1/2c and poor stuff selling down to 8 1/2c for top.

CALIFORNIA PEAS ARE POOR Owing to extreme poor quality, California peas are disappearing from the local market and local stock of better quality is making its appearance in improved supply.
