

LOWEST PRICES IN MANY YEARS ARE REALIZED IN VEAL MARKET HERE

OLD POTATO DEMAND ONCE AGAIN LIBERAL WITH MARKET ACTIVE

Call Is Quite Pronounced Along Street for Both Table and Seed Purposes—General Sales of Best Around \$1.75 Cental Today.

Old onions are nearly cleaned up in the local territory, and the trend of the trade is liberal. This fact is under control of the Confederated Onion Growers' association has just been shipped to a northern market.

Since it became known in the trade here that stocks of old onions were so limited, there has been a very noticeable increase in the demand. Good old crop onions are exceedingly scarce and holders are at present standing firm at \$1.25 a cental here. Country holders are asking 17c a cental for early points, and are getting it for quality offerings. Poor quality is selling at such a wide range that it is impossible to quote them.

New crop California onions continue very slow here. The trade is again switching to the old crop Oregon because of the better keeping quality, than the new southern offerings. General sales of crop California are around \$1.25@1.50 a cental.

Front street, California demand for dairy stuff continues liberal, with sales here at 17 1/2c generally. Creamery firm at the recent advance.

TURPENTINE HIGHER AGAIN. Still another advance of a gallon is reported in the country territory to Portland, and few of these are of suitable quality for plant-ers.

SHIPPERS' WEATHER NOTICE. Weather bureau sends the following notice to shippers: Protect shipments as far north as Seattle and Spokane, about 40 degrees; Portland to Spokane, 40 degrees; southern to Boise, 35 degrees; south to Reno, 30 degrees; Portland to Reno, 25 degrees; Portland tonight about 48 degrees.

JOBBER PRICES OF PORTLAND. These prices are those at which wholesalers sell to retailers, except as otherwise stated. Flour—Wheat, 100 lb. sack, 1.15; 50 lb. sack, 1.10; 25 lb. sack, 1.05; 12 1/2 lb. sack, 1.00.

CHICKEN MARKET IS SLOW. Very slow market is showing for chickens in the front street, and hens are today higher than with ordinary lots down to 1 1/2c generally. Small springs are still hard to move, but larger birds are held steady.

BEAN PRICES ARE LOWERED. Owing to the extreme price of foreign freights, the price of beans is lower in California, and this market has followed with a substantial reduction. Both small and large whites are today quoted at the same price.

EGG MARKET IS FIRMER. Increased strength is shown for eggs, especially the western, and sales are reported today more general at 21c for the latter. Case count continues strong at 19c. Receipts are only fair here.

BRIEF NOTES OF THE TRADE. Strawberries were scarce and higher today. Hood River up to 2c with local at 1 1/2c. Generally, with prices firm.

DAIRY BUTTER IS FIRMER. Firmer tone and in some quarters higher prices are being quoted for dairy butter along with the market.
