

SEVEN RECORDS MAY BE SET TOMORROW IN N-W. ATHLETIC MEET

Great Rivals of Northwest Colleges and Clubs Compete at Multnomah Field.

CHANGE MARATHON RACE

Chairman Hawkins Finds It Necessary to Alter Course; Big Meet Will Start at 8:30 o'clock.

Event - The Pacific Northwest association track and field championship meet.

With a list of record breaking performers entered, the annual Pacific Northwest association track and field championships will be staged tomorrow afternoon on the Multnomah field under the auspices of the Multnomah Amateur Athletic club.

Queen Sybil of the festival and her maids of honor, accompanied by the Rosarians, the Cherrians, the Tillucums and other organizations will be present during the events.

There is a possibility of seven new records being hung up. The discus record will likely be bettered by three contestants, George Philbrook of the Multnomah club, Eupert Edwards of the University of Washington, and Cole of the O. A. C. team.

The mile run record was likely lowered a couple of seconds with the old rivals, McClure, Huggins and Clyde pitted against each other.

A change was made in the course of the five mile race yesterday. After going around the track once, the runners will go down Salmon street to Chapman, north on Chapman to Taylor, east on Taylor to Tenth, south on Tenth to Fifth, south on Fifth to Carruthers, east on Carruthers to Second, north on Second to Hall, west on Hall to Tenth, north on Tenth to Taylor, west on Taylor to Chapman, south on Chapman to Salmon, west on Salmon to the entrance of the field, then one and one-half times around the track.
