

ONE CURIOSITY IN THE FORESTRY BUILDING IS ROOT-CIRCLED LOG

Freak Which Is Frequently
Overlooked Is One of Most
Interesting Exhibits.

HISTORY OF STRUCTURE

Building Erected During Lewis and
Clark Expedition to Show Oregon's
Timber Resources.

At the Forestry building, which attracts the attention of so many tourists that it is considered far and away the best advertisement of Oregon's timber resources, is one curiosity that many overlook.

Several centuries ago when only Indians populated Oregon a Port Orford cedar fell after it had attained size and maturity. In the course of years a tideland spruce seedling began to thrust its roots into the decaying bark. It had been growing 175 years when the Lewis and Clark expedition was held and its roots had entirely encircled the still sound cedar log. In this condition both were cut from their bed and brought to the exposition. The cedar embraced by the spruce in a grip that cannot be broken is on exhibition at the Forestry building on the old exposition grounds and may be seen by all visitors.

For general information, Martin W. Gorman, custodian of the building and one of the best known botanists in the west, has prepared the following statement:

Build of Douglas Fir.

The Forestry building was erected by the Oregon state commission of the Lewis and Clark centennial exposition in the autumn of 1904 and early winter months of 1905, as an exhibit of the lumber and forest resources of Oregon. The building is almost entirely constructed of Douglas fir, the most abundant and valuable tree of the Pacific coast, as well as of this state.

The logs for its construction were chiefly obtained from Columbia and Clatsop counties on the lower Columbia river, towed by steamer up the Columbia and Willamette rivers to Gull's lake, and hauled thence to the site of the building by means of a powerful donkey engine over a tramway specially constructed to protect the bark in transit. The trees were cut and the logs floated down the river in winter months of 1904. During the period when the sap was at rest and the bark in the best condition to insure its adhesion to the trunk.

The building is 206 feet long, 103 feet wide and 72 feet in height. In its construction two million of large fir logs, eight miles of poles, 30,000 fir bark shingles and 43,000 fir shakes were used. These fir shakes have since been replaced by 1,400,000 red cedar shingles, as the latter are less liable to cupping and furnish a closer fitting roof. The floor contains 25,000 feet of vertical grain fir flooring in which a single defect, such as a knot or pitch seam, cannot be found.

Foundation Is Concrete.

The walls and pillars rest on a firm concrete foundation. The pillars, of which there are 64 in all, are 54 feet in height and average 8000 feet of lumber each, the whole building scaling 1,000,000 feet of lumber board measure. The heaviest pillar weighed 35 tons, and the whole building at the time of construction weighed 32,440 tons.

On entering the building the first idea suggested to the artistic visitor, by the pillars and aisles, is that of an Egyptian temple, and this idea is still further borne out by the many eminent singers and musicians who have visited it, and found its acoustical qualities equal to those of a temple or cathedral; while the impression produced on the tourist on entering, is that he is in a veritable forest of giant fir. The building is maintained for the distinct purpose of exhibiting the lumber and forest resources of Oregon and specimens of most of the 34 species of trees growing in the state can be found here. It is, therefore, desirable that this object be held in view in adding to the collection, and that exploitation of the building and its contents by private individuals or corporations be entirely prohibited.

Many of the exhibits have been loaned or contributed by private parties, and it is hoped within the next few years to have every arborescent species in the state represented in the collection.

Forest Resource Great.

Next to land itself, the forests of Oregon constitute its greatest resource at the present time. During the past 12 years the federal government has had estimates made at different times of the total standing timber of the United States. Those estimates vary considerably, owing, not to any error on the part of the experts engaged in the work, but to the different standards employed.

During this period the standard has been materially reduced and the estimates proportionately increased. At a conservative estimate Oregon has at the present time approximately 456,000,000,000 feet of standing timber board measure. This represents the most one fifth of the total standing merchantable timber of the United States, or proportionately private land more than the state of Washington and 43 per cent more than California—the two next largest timber producing states.

The Pacific coast states contain about 55 per cent of the total standing timber of the United States at present, their proportions being as follows:

Oregon, 18.43; Washington, 13.95; California, 12.62; Idaho, 4.51; Montana, 2.43 per cent respectively.
