

FRED LYNCH WILL DIRECT CAMPAIGN OF DEMOCRATIC PARTY

New Executive Committee Chairman Has Had 15 Years' Experience.

HAILS FROM MINNESOTA

The Late John A. Johnson Is Declared to Have Been a Discovery of Lynch's.

Between now and a year and a half from now you are going to read the name of Frederick B. Lynch a good many times, though it soon will be printed simply Fred Lynch, since that is the name by which the new chairman of the Democratic campaign committee is known by those who work with him.

Lynch is an interesting sort. Being some inches above six feet in height and several pounds over 200 in weight, he was not designed by nature to be overlooked. He is a slow speaking, calm sort of man and his opinions seem to carry weight when he utters them.

Not a public speaker, Lynch is rated as a splendid maker of friends. He has served as peace-maker among warring Democrats of Minnesota many times, it is told, due to his determination to play fair and his ability to do so.

John A. Johnson, Minnesota's great Democratic governor, sometimes has been called a "discovery" of Lynch's. If he was that, it happened in this wise: Johnson had made an exceptional record in the state senate. The Democratic organization wanted a candidate that could win and saw possibilities in Johnson. Lynch and another went to St. Peter, where Johnson had resumed the job of making people read his little country newspaper.

His Mexican policy? Undoubtedly the support thus indicated was for the president's insistence that the Mexican factions should be allowed to settle their differences among themselves.
