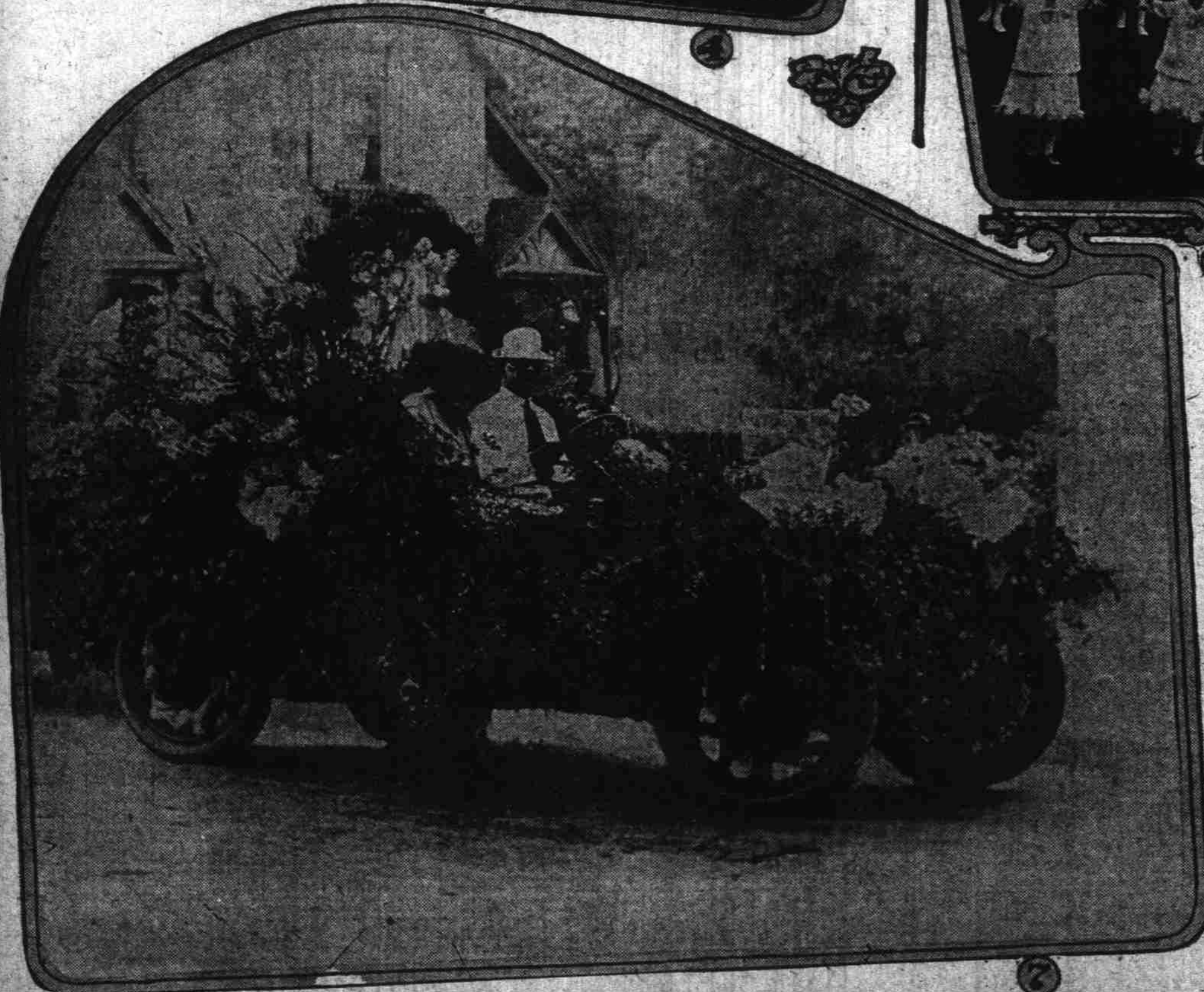
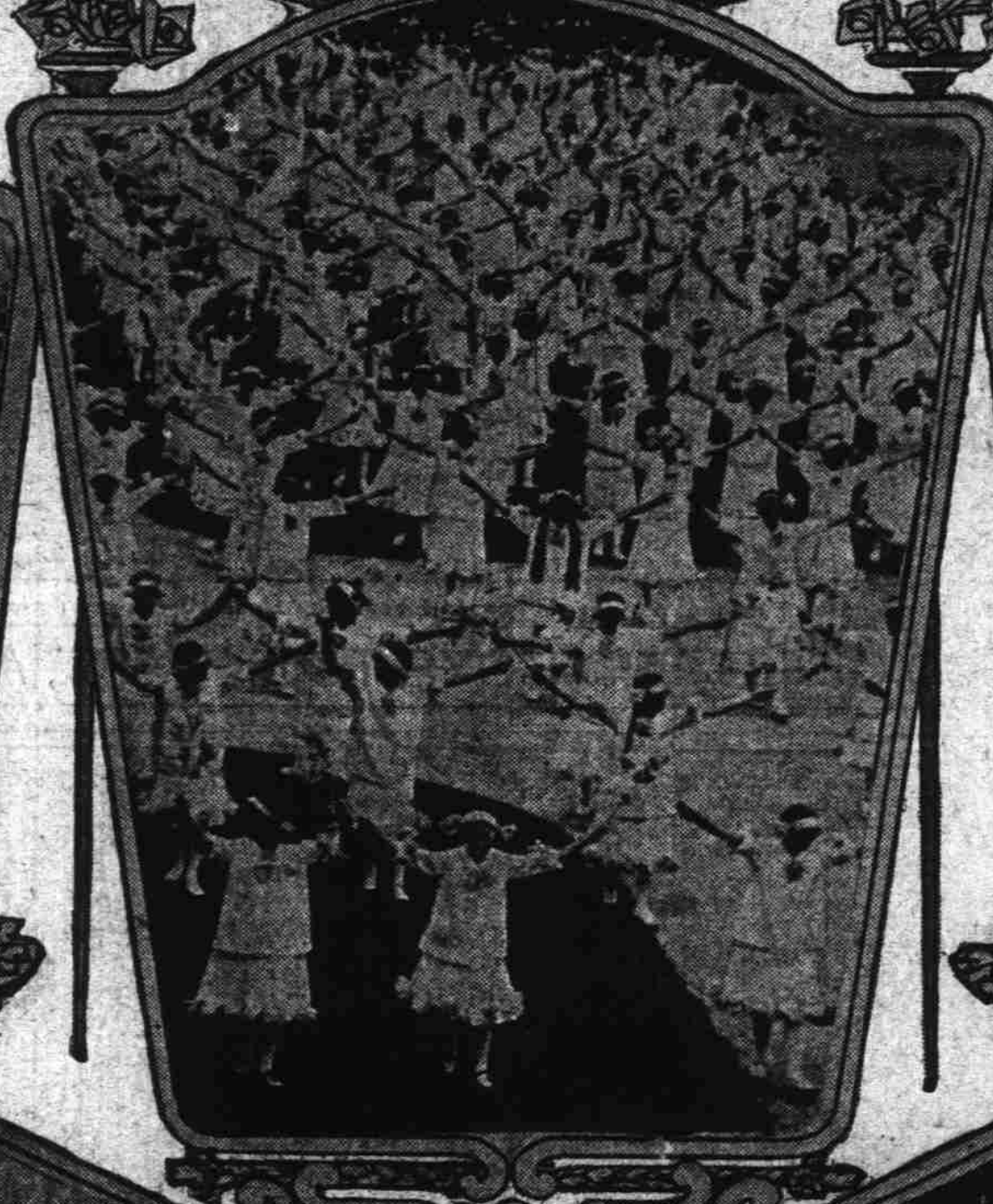


ROSE FESTIVAL DAYS WERE CROWDED WITH BRILLIANT PAGEANTRY.
