

COMMITTEE NAMES SIMON BENSON AS FIRST IN CITIZENSHIP

Wealthy Philanthropist to Be Specially Honored at Panama-Pacific Exposition.

BEGAN WITHOUT FUNDS

Resolutions to City and State, and Unanimous Nature, Points on Which Decision is Reached.

Simon Benson has been chosen as Oregon's highest type of citizenship by a committee appointed by Governor Withycombe to select a representative of the state to receive special honor at the Panama-Pacific exposition on a day designated for this purpose.

The elements that entered into the choice of Mr. Benson for the distinguished honor were:

First. His benefactions to the city of Portland in the shape of drinking fountains and public parks.

Second. His interest in and contributions towards highway development.

Third. His recognition of the position of the state in the world.

Another factor that weighed with the committee was the modest, unassuming nature of Mr. Benson and his lack of political ambition.

The committee, which made the selection was composed of the following: H. L. Pittcock, chairman; John F. Carroll, C. E. Moore, Frank A. Moore, chief justice of the state supreme

court; Dr. P. L. Campbell, president of the University of Oregon; Dr. W. J. Kerr, president of the Oregon Agricultural college, and Mrs. Clara H. Waldo.

The committee will next communicate with the exposition management and arrange a date on which its choice can be in San Francisco and when a large number of Oregon people can join with those of other states in paying their tributes of respect.

Estimated Will be Presented. The exposition will cooperate in arranging an appropriate program at which a handsome diploma or other tangible testimonial can be conferred.

Commenting on the choice of the committee Governor Withycombe said: "Mr. Benson certainly is deserving of the honor. I hope that Mr. Benson day will be one of the most brilliant features of the exposition."

"The main idea to my mind," said John F. Carroll, a member of the committee, "was to recognize a new era in the advancement of the state and the Pacific coast. Mr. Benson has been conspicuous among men who are capable of doing good in that he has worked for the advancement of the state. His active interest for good roads means a great thing for Oregon. In many other ways he is doing good for the state. Moreover he is a plain everyday citizen, readily approached and an ideal type in every particular."

Mr. Waldo said: "While I have not known Mr. Benson personally, the suggestion of naming him met with my immediate approval. He seems to stand for all the things that mean the wholesome advancement and development of the state."

Mr. Benson Disapproves. The only person thus far to express a disapproval of the committee's choice is Mr. Benson himself. "It seems to me," said he, "that the committee used poor judgment. There are thousands in Oregon more worthy the honor than I."

Mr. Benson, who is about 60 years of age, is a native of Norway. He came to the United States with his parents when he was 16 years old and settled in Wisconsin.

His first employment was on a farm at 15 a month and board.

A few years later, after he had married, the western fever struck him and

he came to Colfax, Wash. After a short stay there he moved to Columbia county in this state and entered the logging business.

Bought Game on Credit. His first taste of success was bought on credit. He worked hard for 10 years without tangible result, but in 1891 the Benson luck set in and he made money fast.

About six years ago he disposed of his holdings for a sum approximating four million dollars and retired from active business.

Since that time he has busied himself with plans to help his fellow man.

Third Regiment to Go Into Camp July 5. Twelve Companies Will Receive Instruction Under Guidance of Army Officers at Gearhart for 10 Days.

Preparations are complete for the annual encampment of the Third regiment infantry, Oregon national guard. Six companies from Portland and six from outside points will leave Monday morning, July 5, for Gearhart, where preparations for the reception of the troops have already been made by Captain Henry Hockmeyer and a force of 15 men get ahead some days ago.

The companies from Portland are B, C, D, E, F and H, and the outside companies are A, McMinnville; L, Dallas; G, Oregon City; K, Corvallis; M, Salem; I, Woodburn. In addition there will be the sanitary corps.

The regiment is commanded by Colonel McLaughlin, U. S. A., and Lieutenant Kenneth P. Williams, U. S. A., will be inspector instructor. There will be also other regular army officers in attendance.

There will be 10 days of active instruction in different branches of military science, and special schools of instruction for the officers. There will be opportunities in the afternoon for social enjoyment, sports and exercises. The guardsmen will break camp July 14, returning to their civilian life the next day.
