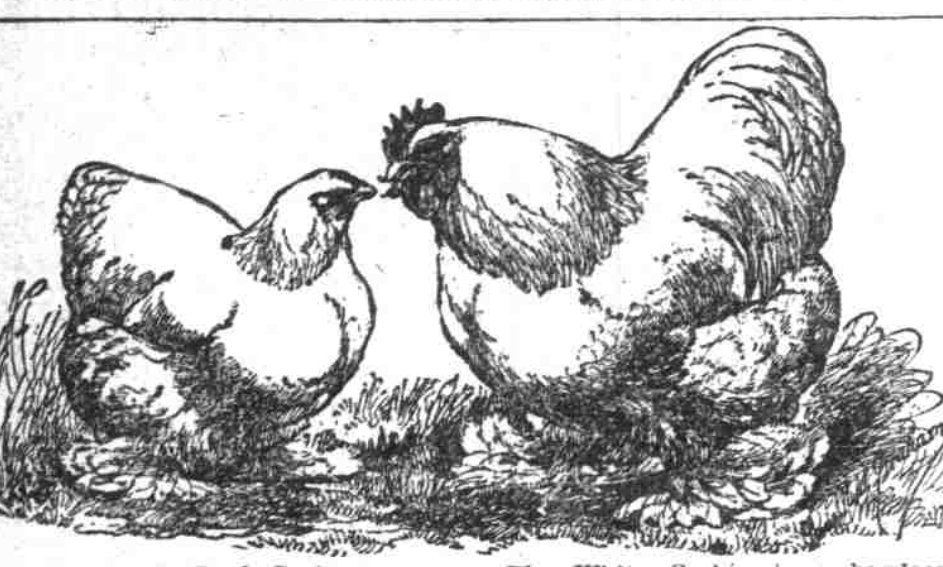

Keeping Chickens On a Small Scale

Poultry can be kept successfully on a small amount of land, and this is desirable to divide the lot and sow part of it with some quick growing grain such as oats, wheat or rye.

For the poultry house, about four square feet of floor space per bird should be allowed for the general purpose breeds. The other essentials are fresh air, dryness and sunlight.
