Their heads were crushed almost beyond recognition, and their throats cut from ear to ear.

# JACKSON CLUB GIVES STRONG INDOORMENT TO THE FERRIS BILL

### Speaker at Meeting Declares Opposition Comes From "Power Site Grabbers."

Throwing aside a provision of the club constitution against passing a resolution at the same meeting, the Jackson club last night unanimously passed the foregoing indoorment to the Ferris bill.

State Senator Claude McCulloch, who spoke on the bill and the effort being made to discredit the measure at the Portland waterpower conference, said he was "glad to see the opponents of the bill's measure as a 'masquerade in sheep's clothing to conceal the claws of the wolf.'"

"The Ferris bill is one of the last of the great line of constructive measures that fell to the Wilson administration for enactment," said Mr. McCulloch. "Ten years of agitation beginning with Roosevelt's time had only caused the people to wake up to the seriousness of protecting their equity in the undeveloped water powers of the western domain."
