WATER RIGHT FIGHT DEVELOPS DEFENSE TERMED A NOVELTY

City Asked to Stop Proceedings to Restrain Use of Creek by Lumber Company

ARGUMENT IS REVIEWED

Bridal Veil Lumber Company Claims Mill More Important to City Than Increased Water Flow.

A novel plea has been advanced by the Bridal Veil Lumber company in its request to the city of Portland to stop proceedings in the United States district court to restrain the company from diverting the waters of Young's creek, which form the waterfalls at Shepperd's Dell, one of the most scenic points on the Columbia river highway.

In its plea the company's officials say:

"The continuous operation of a plant representing \$1,600,000 in money and employing 300 men the year round is of more consequence to the city of Portland than increasing the flow over the falls at Shepperd's Dell."

It will be remembered that George Shepperd recently gave a few acres of land embracing Shepperd's Dell to the city as a park. At the last legislative session a law was enacted withdrawing from appropriation or condemnation any of the water in streams in which there are waterfalls along the Columbia river highway in order to preserve them.

But has been brought by the city and Mr. Shepperd to compel the company to abstain from further appropriation.

"Even though the city officials may decide to drop the suit, said E. E. Covert, 'Mr. Shepperd, my client, will go ahead with it. We want to determine whether the lumber company has any legal title to the water."

"We contend that it has not. After it has been established that it has not, we will be ready to consider how the water shall be disposed of. As to the argument that the company will be deprived of a church, I might suggest that it establish an auxiliary steam plant. The real point at issue, however, is whether the company has any legal right to divert water from the falls."

Frank Pound, Civil War Veteran, Dead

Post Commander High Odd Fellow and A. O. U. W. Member Passes Away at Home in Salem.

Frank L. Pound, commander of Sedgwick No. 10, Grand Army of the Republic, died at his home in Salem, Saturday, November 11, at the age of 71 years.

The funeral was held Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the Methodist Episcopal church, with interment in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

Mr. Pound was born in Marengo, Wayne county, N. Y., May 16, 1844. He lived there until 16 years of age, when he moved with his parents to Illinois, from which place he enlisted at 18 years of age in the 104th Illinois volunteer infantry. He served faithfully for three and one-half years, when the war closed.

In 1867 he was united in marriage to Susan M. Downing, niece of Susan M. Downing-Shepherd, one of Oregon's first women ministers. In 1870 the family moved to Jewell county, Kan.

Only one son, O. A. Pound of Aumville, Ok., and one daughter, Mrs. J. B. Dresslar of Mankato, Kan., survive this union.

In 1875 he was married to Libby M. Winslow at Jewell City, Kan., to this union were born one son, Dr. E. B. Pound of Salem, Lottie Pound Gilbert, Portland, Or., Mrs. Minerva P. Holcomb, Grants Pass, Miss Ruby Eva Pound, Portland, and Jeanette, Jewell, Pa. He is also survived by two brothers, T. S. Pound, Glen Elder, Kan., and C. E. Pound, Canaan, Wash., one sister, Mrs. T. J. Wyland, South Center, Kan.

He was a member of the I. O. O. F. and A. O. U. W. lodges. For many years he has been a local member of the Methodist Episcopal church. His loss is deeply felt by all those who had known him.
