

SOMEWHAT BETTER QUALITY IS SHOWN AMONG FIRST TURKEY ARRIVALS

EGG MARKET GOES DOWN TO 35 CENTS FOR FRESH SUPPLIES

Receipts Are Rapidly Increasing Along the Street and Values Are Falling. But Not Fast Enough to Clean Up Offerings.

The egg market is in very bad shape along Front street, and quotations have dropped as low as 35 cents a dozen. The commission houses were offering eggs freely during the day at the lower price, others were not asking over 35c, but at night prices were there are special elimination among dealers to clean up the surplus.

Receipts of fresh eggs along the street are increasing rapidly, and while some of the dealers have not yet been able to feel the growth of surplus, others show by their selling less rapidly than last, at least destined during December.

With fresh eggs broken and lower, and receipts increasing fast, it is evident the market is off for storage eggs, especially the lower price ones.

The new arrivals on Saturday, Nov. 25, were 10,000 cases, and the latest delivery, storage, further is expected, showing the effects of the weaker tone and cut in fresh supplies, and various cuts are reported in that direction.
