

OREGON SPORTSMEN WANT LAW OBSERVED AND WILL AID STATE

Influence and Assistance Are Promised to Fish and Game Commission.

VAN DUZER REELECTED

Members Will Begin Campaign for Recruits So That Organization May Make Itself Felt in Big Affairs.

Mapping out plans for the betterment of fish and game protection, appointing committees to investigate several matters of vital interest to the sportsmen of all sections of the state and re-electing the same officers, delegates to the third annual meeting of the Oregon Sportsmen's league opened and closed the most successful meeting of the organization yesterday at the Imperial hotel, Portland.

When President-elect H. B. Van Duzer stated that a motion was in order for adjournment, after Portland was awarded next year's meeting, every delegate was of the opinion that the organization would branch out into the biggest and best in the northwest.

Rogue River Fishing Question.

The report of the resolution committee, dealing with the Rogue river fishing question, was unanimously adopted yesterday afternoon and a committee to settle the matter was appointed by the president. The committee is composed of A. E. Beaman and Dr. J. J. Mefford, L. V. House of Grants Pass, J. B. Johnson of Gold Beach and Walter Backus of Portland.

Game Commission Commended.

The Oregon Game Commission commended the work of the state fish and game commission, and we recommended that the league with its associated associations, cooperate very closely with the game commission in protecting our wild animals and birds.

Steel Heads in Rogue River.

Whereas there is a complaint by sportsmen living along Rogue river to the effect that the steel heads, by reason of their weight and abrasions at the mouth of the river, are destroyed, and because of that fact the steel head is practically worthless, and this organization that when said river was closed to commercial fishing, the fishing was good in said stream, and that the complaints arising and presented are due and are caused in the manner in which said commercial fishing is carried on at the mouth of the river.

Therefore resolved.

That it is the sense of this organization that such measures be instituted as may be found necessary to remove the cause for the complaints lodged by said sportsmen, and that this organization be and hereby is pledged to support such measures as may be found necessary to bring relief to the sportsmen and effectually remove the causes for the complaints made by them.

Resolving in Local Stores.

Carl Shoenaker, state game warden, stated that plans were afoot to place fish and game licenses with sporting goods houses, thereby doing away with the various sporting goods stores and the sale of the license. This met the hearty approval of the delegates, as the state fish and game commission paid the state last week \$500, representing 5 per cent of the sale of licenses.

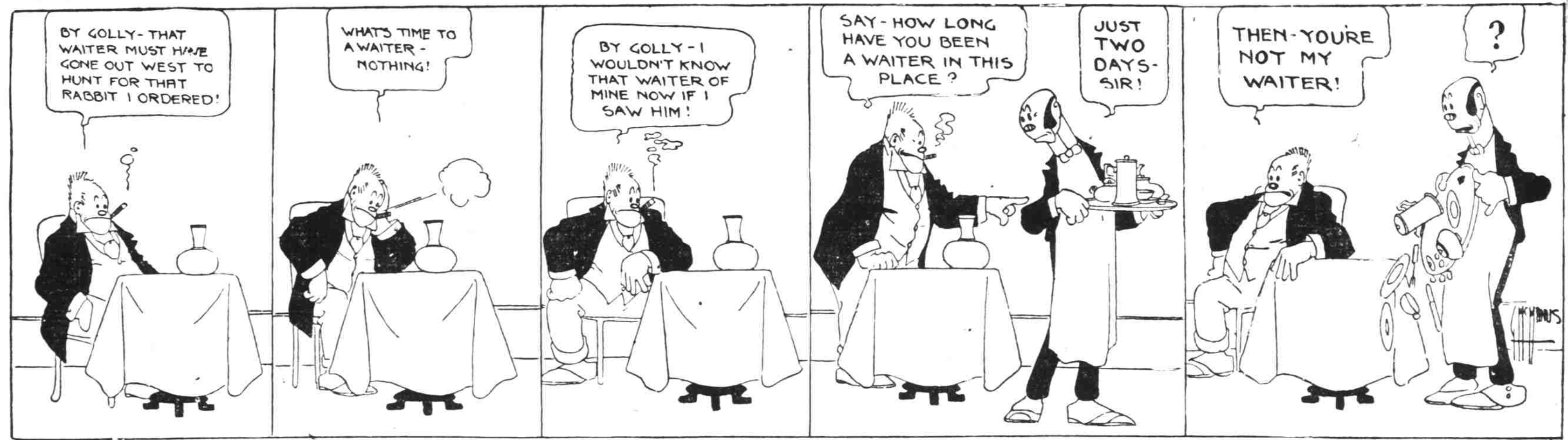
