

PLAN IS ON FOOT TO JOIN PORTLAND AND YAKIMA BY HIGHWAY

Feasibility of Idea Will Be Presented to Good Roads Enthusiasts Tonight.

MORAL SUPPORT ASKED

Scenic Route Would Be Given Which Would Connect With Mount Adams Road.

A plan to connect the Yakima valley with Portland by means of a highway, the feasibility of which has often been suggested by The Journal, will be presented to a number of Portland's leading good roads advocates at a special dinner tonight at the Chamber of Commerce by J. A. Harader, secretary of the North Yakima Commercial club.

The distance from North Yakima by the proposed route is 70 miles and of this there are about 30 miles of fairly good existing road. The greater part of the construction would be within the reservation where an easy grade can be obtained.

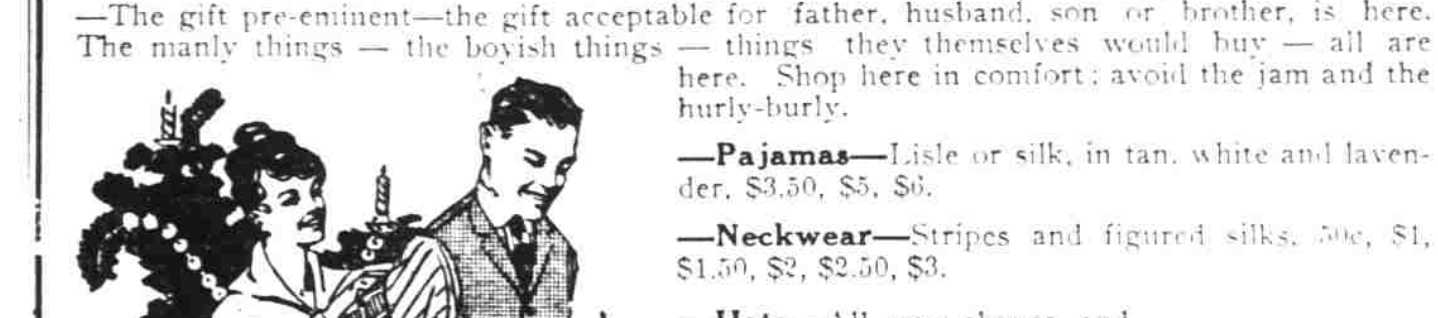
