

OF 94 MEN PAROLED FROM STATE'S PRISON 29 VIOLATED TRUSTS

Report of State Parole Officer Keller Shows 17 Were Returned to Penitentiary.

MEN WROTE GOVERNOR

Word Received From Those Given Freedom by Governor Withycombe Telling of Success.

Salem, Or., Jan. 6.—Ninety-four men have been paroled by Governor Withycombe from the state prison, according to a report submitted by State Parole Officer Keller, and of these 29 have violated their parole and 17 have been returned to the penitentiary. Three parole violators committed crimes in California and are now serving terms in San Quentin penitentiary.

Keller says 14,778 miles were traveled in returning parole violators and the railroad fare and expense in returning parole violators, escapes and miscellaneous work, totaled \$1507.

Many replies have been received to 65 personal letters addressed by Governor Withycombe during the holiday season to 65 men paroled by him who are in good standing, and the writers tell what they are doing, and how they are getting along. In his letter, the governor had expressed that every man would make good, pointing out that the success of the parole system and the opportunity of prisoners to enjoy its privileges depended in a very large measure upon the actions and records of the men who had been released.

The report of Superintendent Minto, filed today, showed that there were 627 inmates of the prison December 31, as compared with 536 December 1. Thirteen were received and 22 released during the month, one of those released being transferred to the hospital for the insane.

Superintendent Minto told the board of control today that he was puzzled as to what he should do with Julian A. Mark, a life-terminer, who has a dangerously contagious type of tuberculosis. He had suggested to Superintendent Ballinger of the tuberculosis institution, a transfer of the patient but Ballinger did not consider it advisable. The board took no action.

Woman a Leader of White Slave Clique

Mrs. Millie Eddy, of Indiana, Pleads Guilty at Tacoma to Transporting Girl to Coast for Immoral Purposes.

Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 6.—(U. P.)—Charged with being one of the leaders of a gigantic white slave ring, which made a business of transporting young women from middle western states to the Pacific coast for immoral purposes, Mrs. Millie Eddy, of Michigan City, Indiana, was arraigned and pleaded guilty before Federal Judge Cushman today, having aided in transporting Edna Schwartz from Chicago to Tacoma.

Mrs. Eddy was arrested in Chicago ten days ago following the conviction here of Charles Ludwig, who had furnished the funds on which Mrs. Eddy and the Schwartz girl traveled to the coast.

Laborer Commits Suicide.
Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 6.—(P. N. S.)—F. E. Griggs, a laborer, committed suicide here Wednesday by shooting himself while in his room at a local rooming house. Dependancy is thought to be the cause.

Chief of Police Resigns.
Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 5.—(P. N. S.)—Broken in health, Chief of Police Ardella P. Loomis has tendered his resignation to Commissioner Mills, in a communication in which he requests that he be allowed to continue on as head of the police department until the termination of the current month.

States Conflict on Custody of Child

California Judge Gives Dr. Rudolph M. Gerber Custody of Daughter, But Washington Judge May Keep Child.

Seattle, Wash., Jan. 6.—(U. P.)—With Dr. Rudolph M. Gerber of San Francisco speeding toward Seattle armed with a decree of divorce awarding him custody of his little daughter Arel, now a juvenile court ward here, Mrs. Gerber is contending with her lawyers to again frustrate her ex-husband's plans to take the child.

The San Francisco court named Dr. Gerber as custodian of his daughter, but when he arrives here to obtain her release from juvenile court he will be up against further difficulties. Superior Judge Dykeman, who has the little girl in charge, may hold that the California court cannot interfere with the Washington court's possession of the child.

Gets Divorce From Prominent Clubman

Mrs. Amy J. Whitney, Member of Idaho's Divorce Colony, Is Given Her Children and \$300 a Month Alimony.

Pocatello, Idaho, Jan. 6.—Mrs. Amy J. Whitney, a member of the Idaho divorce colony for the past several months, was Wednesday granted a divorce from Livingston Whitney, prominent clubman, retired broker and mining man residing at Morrisburg, N. J. She was given custody of the children and \$300 a month alimony. The decree was given by Judge Fred Cowan at Blackfoot.

Dragged From Blazing Bed.
Seattle, Wash., Jan. 6.—(P. N. S.)—W. C. Roach was saved from probable death here today when his wife dragged him from his blazing bed. Roach is an invalid. He was seriously burned about the face, hands and arms. The fire was extinguished before it could spread to other parts of the house.
