

INUNCTION IS SOUGHT TO RESTRAIN BOYCOTT BANNER MEN'S WORK

Contention in Behalf of Jones Market Raises New Issues From Legal Point.

PETITIONS ARE PRESENTED

It is Contended That in Oregon Property Owners' Rights Extend to the Center of the Street.

Petition for an injunction to restrain bannermen from parading before the Jones Market at Fourth and Alder streets, in an effort to divert trade from the place, was filed in the circuit court this morning.

George Eates and Harold M. Sawyer, acting as attorneys for the Jones Market, bring out several new contentions in their petition. They contend that a property owner in Oregon owns to the center of the street, and that the owner's rights are subject only to public easement. Use of streets for anything except the purpose for which they were intended, it is contended, is trespass, subject to abatement by injunction.

Bannermen now parading at Fourth and Alder streets are trying to divert trade from the Jones Market on the ground that the place is an "unfair" shop.

Various of them expressed belief that the peace movement is spreading and that definite results in this line at The Hague next week.

Neither excitement nor emotion was noted in Germany. No demonstrations occurred and the only incident manifested in the peace party occurred at Bremen where a small crowd of soldiers and civilians stood on the platform and watched them in silence.
