

## ROGUE RIVER VALLEY FRUIT MEN URGED TO FIGHT ORCHARD PESTS

C. C. Cate Awakens Growers  
to Necessity of Exterminating  
Apple, Pear Scabs.

### BLIGHT IS BEING TREATED

Recently Appointed Agriculturist and  
Horticulturist of County Waging  
Determined Battle.

Medford, Or., Feb. 8.—Claude C. Cate, recently appointed county agriculturist and horticulturist for this field, has awakened the orchardists and fruit men generally throughout the valley as never before as to the absolute necessity of the proper and prompt action in a fully cooperative way throughout the fruit districts in the matter of eradicating fruit pests and otherwise attacking orchard diseases and vineyards. Especially is this campaign being waged against the existence of the apple and pear scab. Incidentally, the blight is being treated. Pathologist Cate is being assisted by Horticulturist Commissioner A. C. Allen, whose administration of the business of this district last year saved over \$10,000 to the fruit men of the county and the state.

### Ships First Canned Goods.

Medford, Or., Feb. 8.—The Rogue River Valley Canning company shipped the first of two carloads of its output of canned goods Saturday to Dodge City, Kansas, the most eastern point to which canned products of this state have been exported in that quantity. The locally manufactured product commanded an advance of 40 cents the case over current prices, thus showing appreciation of its quality.

### Appoint Poultry Show Judges.

Medford, Or., Feb. 8.—Judge F. B. Keeney, one of the leading poultry judges of the country and who served as commissioner from Oregon at all of the poultry exhibitions at the Panama-Pacific exposition last year, has been engaged to judge for the poultry show of the Southern Oregon Poultry association which will open in this city on February 9 and continue four days. A lecturer from the Oregon Agricultural college has been engaged.

Wenatchee, Wash., Feb. 8.—Great Northern westbound fast mail No. 27 was wrecked late Sunday afternoon at Rock Island, 10 miles east of here by running into an open switch.

## Danger of Ice Jam At Weiser Is Past

Both Snake and Weiser Rivers Are  
Flowing Freely—Jam at Midvale Has  
Caused Considerable Damage.

Weiser, Idaho, Feb. 8.—The rumor of danger from an ice jam is unfounded. Both the Snake and Weiser rivers are flowing freely and waters are not unusually high for this time of the year. Unprecedented heavy snows with threatening rain may cause later floods, but little apprehension of danger at this point is felt. An ice jam at Midvale, 30 miles north of here on the Weiser river, has caused considerable damage and the river channel has partially changed, but the water is not being backed up and no additional flood is anticipated.

## Burbank Company Becomes Bankrupt

Voluntary Petition Filed at San Fran-  
cisco Showing Liabilities of \$73,372  
and Intangible Assets of \$108,559.

San Francisco, Feb. 8.—(P. N. S.)—A voluntary petition in bankruptcy was filed Monday by the Luthur Burbank corporation, with liabilities of \$73,372 and assets \$108,559. It is stated in the petition that although there is a preponderance of assets, this is not intangible and cannot readily be converted into money. Among them is \$24,000 worth of real estate, \$14,383 of seeds, bulbs and plants and \$170 on hand.

## TEN YEARS ADDED TO TERM OF CONVICT FOR CRIME DURING PAROLE

Claude O. Ross, Committed  
From Multnomah County,  
Assaulted Mill City Girl.

### DOES NOT LIKE HIS TITLE

Asks That He Not Be Called as Con-  
firmed Criminal Because He  
Served Four Terms.

Salem, Or., Feb. 8.—Claude O. Ross, a convict serving a sentence in the state prison here for forgery, committed from Multnomah county, was sentenced here Monday to serve 10 years for criminal assault. The crime was committed while he was on parole from the prison following his commitment on a charge of obtaining money by false pretenses. The girl involved, a resident of Mill City, was only 16 at the time.

Ross told Circuit Judge Kelly, when asked if he had anything to say, that he did not want to be regarded as a confirmed criminal because he had served four terms in the state prison when a boy, one term at Folsom, one at San Quentin and one at the Oregon prison.

Visalia, Cal., Feb. 8.—(U. P.)—Superior Judge Allen Monday sentenced Mrs. Mary Hines, wife of John Hines, a Richmond saloonkeeper, to serve five years in San Quentin for arson. She was convicted Friday. A new trial was denied. Hines broke down and wept on his wife's shoulder as she was being led from the courtroom.

Bend, Or., Feb. 8.—Edward A. Knotts of Bend died January 23. He was a native Oregonian, born in Yamhill county, January 15, 1848.

He leaves a widow and four children: Merle Knotts, Dr. Roy Knotts, Yuma, Arizona; Ivan Knotts, Imperial, Or.; and Miss Vera Knotts, Moody, Or. Mr. Knotts was a member of the I. O. O. F. for 38 years.

## Surprise Parties by British Are Success

Under New British Commander Forces  
Are Making Night Sorties Without  
Attempting to Hold Trenches Won.

London, Feb. 8.—A new feature of the British dispatches from the western front since Sir Douglas Haig assumed supreme command has been the number of successful raids conducted by British surprise parties against trenches. Advancing stealthily by night, the British soldiers suddenly invaded the enemy's trenches, killing or capturing the majority of its occupants, return with their prisoners to their own lines. There appears to be no attempt to hold the enemy trench against counter attacks, so the losses sustained on the British side are unusually insignificant.
