

**CHURCHES IN AMERICA
ENJOYED REMARKABLE
GROWTH DURING 1915**

Report to Federated Council
Indicates That 40 Per Cent
of People Are Members.

CATHOLIC GAIN GREATEST

Baptists, South; Methodists, South
Presbyterians, North and Methodists,
North, Follow in Order Named.

New York, Feb. 12.—According to figures given out today by the federal council of churches, the churches of the United States, irrespective of denomination, had the greatest growth in their history last year.

The report indicates that of the 100,000,000 Americans, approximately

40,000,000 are church members.
