The rainfall in the last 24 hours was light to average northwest Washington, southern British Columbia, northwestern Montana, Oklahoma and the lower Missouri and upper Mississippi valleys, moderately heavy in southwestern Colorado and eastern North Dakota, and heavy in northern British Columbia. The weather is cooler on the California coast and from Arizona northward to Canada; it is warmer in most other sections, especially in the interior north-west, where temperatures are above normal except in southern Oregon and southern Idaho.
