

Calls Quotation Regarding Hughes Credited to Him Preposterous and Untrue.

## SAYS STONE IS MISTAKEN

Charge of Falsifying History by Editorials and Senator Regarding the Deaths in Mexico Discussed.

Oyster Bay, N. Y., May 5 .-- (I. N. S.) -Colonel Roosevelt took exception today to a recent statement in the New York "World" to the effect that he had referred to Justice Hughes as "That Baptist hypocrite."

"This," he said, "is just as prepos-terous as if it had said that Mr. Hughes had called me a Dutch re-Former Dinosaur. One statement Would be just as untrue as the other and just as ridiculous."

The colonel was asked to comment on editorials charging him with having falsified history in his address before the Methodist social union. In that address he compared the record of unavenged-American deaths at the hands of "representatives of foreign governments" during the Wilson administration with the record of his own administration. United States Senator Stone has also been quoted as having taken the colonel to task on the same grounds.

Colonel Roosevelt said:

"As for the statement in reference to the fact that Americans were murdered in Mexico, Senator Stone says 1 stated 'that no Americans lost their lives on foreign soil through acts of foreigners during my administration."

no Americans were slain 'by representatives of any foreign nations." The editorials refer to certain Americans killed in brawls by bandits or in mob conflicts and to four Americans killed by Yaqui Indians. Not one of these men was killed by a 'representatice of Mexico' or any other foreign nation. Of course, every year, every where, in every country, citizens of that country and occasionally foreigners are killed by ordinary criminals and this even in great civilized cities."


