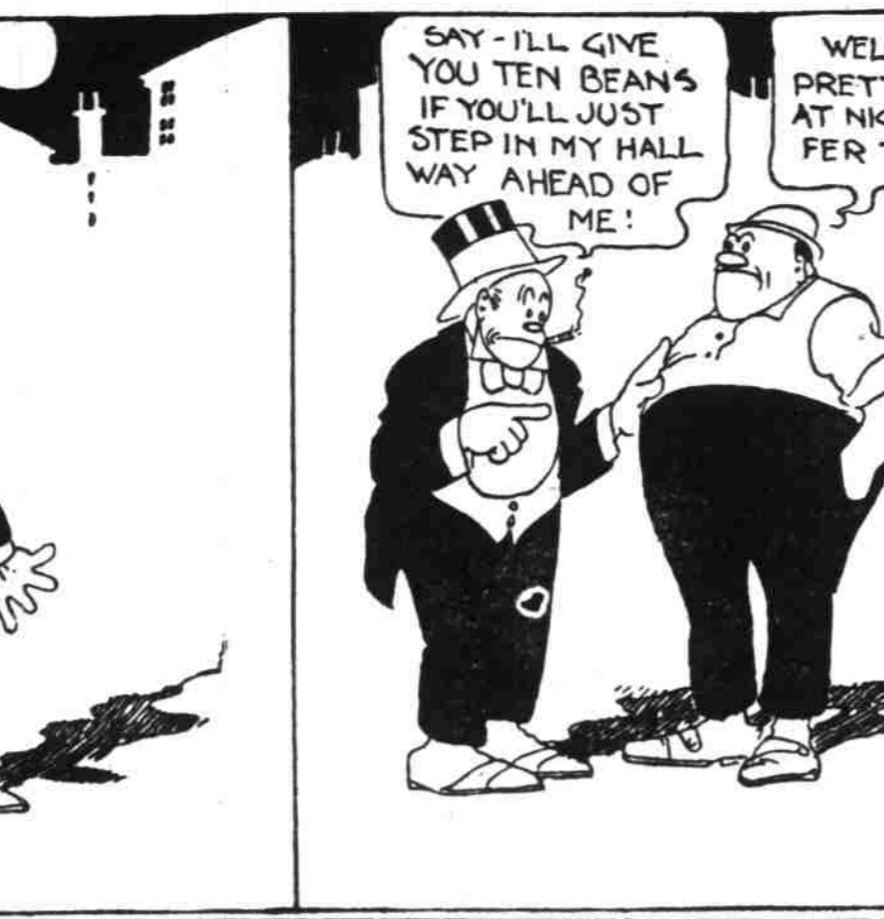

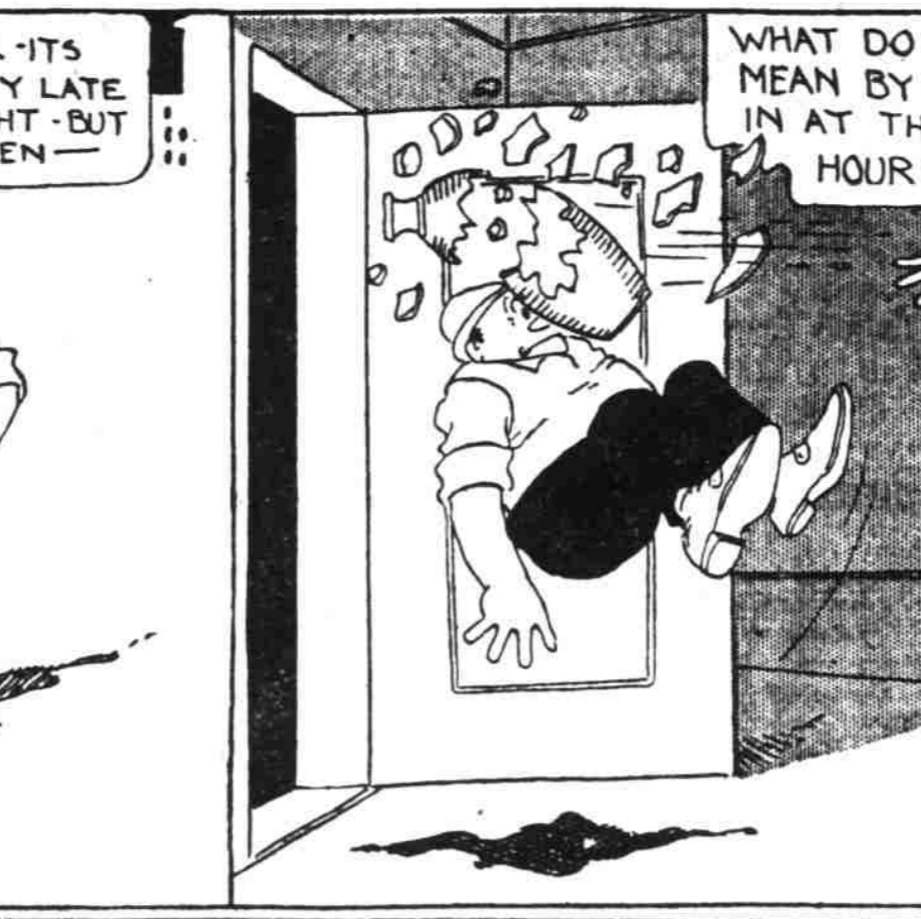

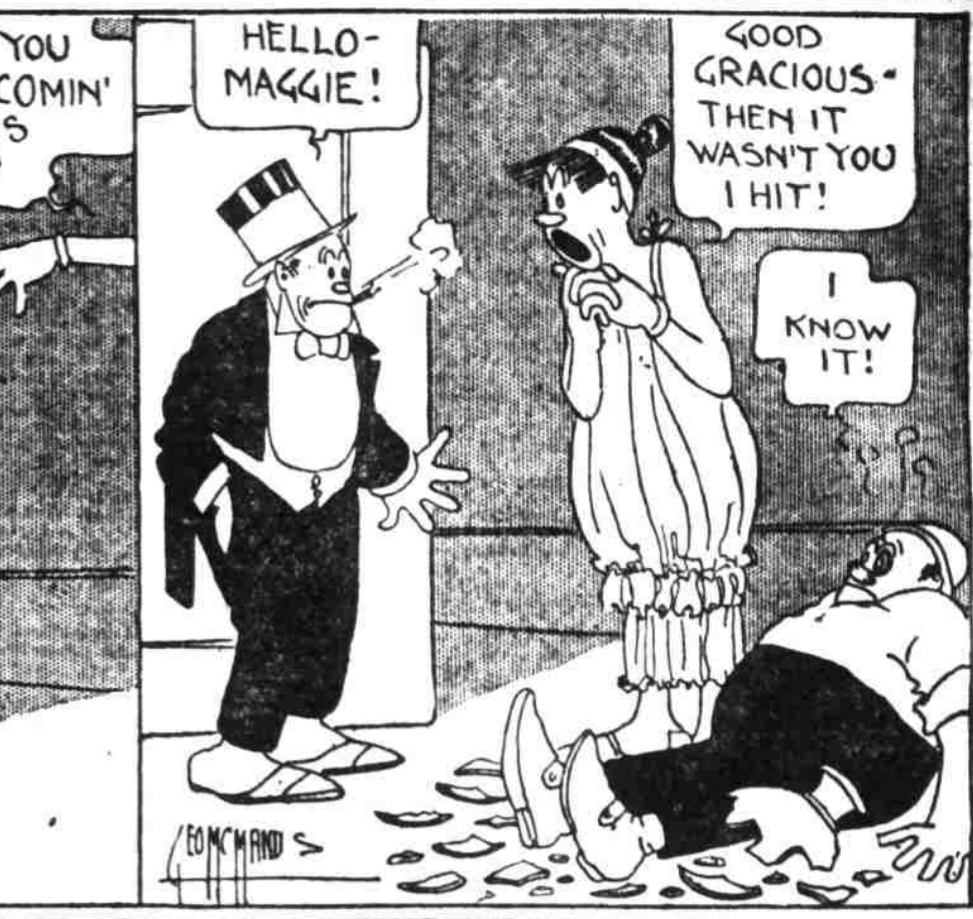

COUNCIL VOTES TO RAISE FUND FOR CITY GOLF LINKS



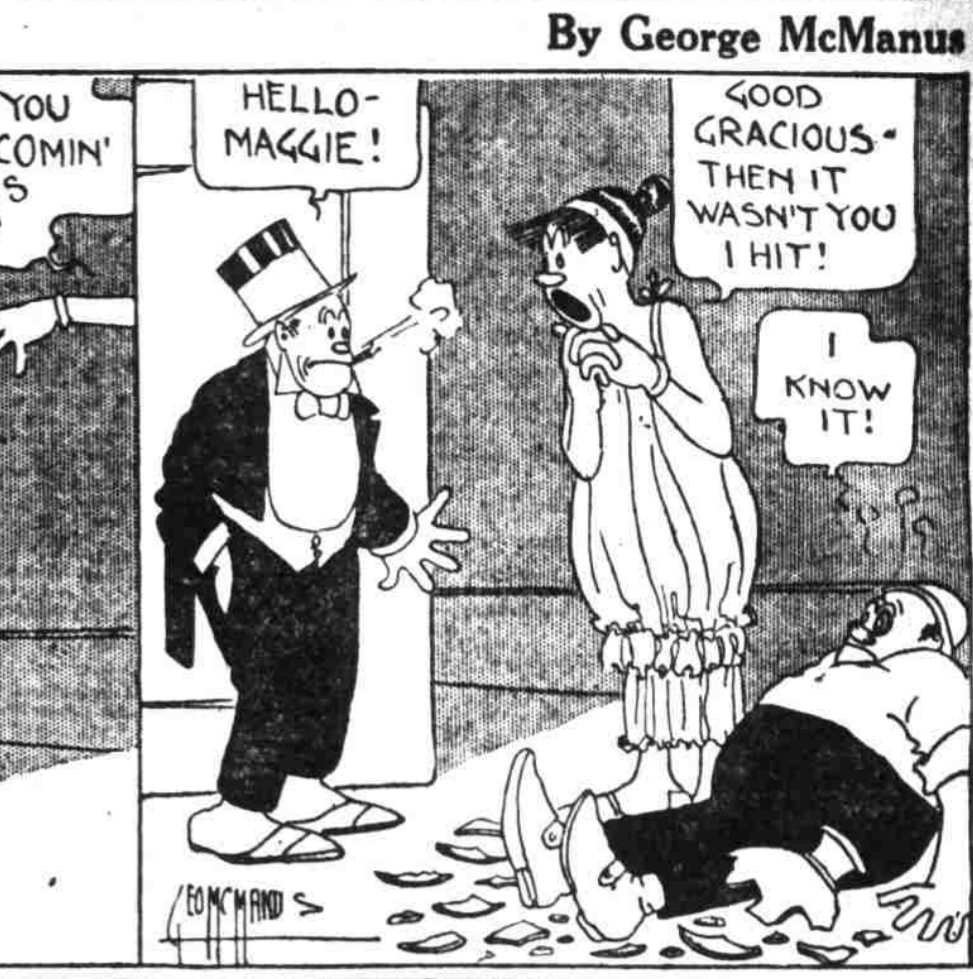
