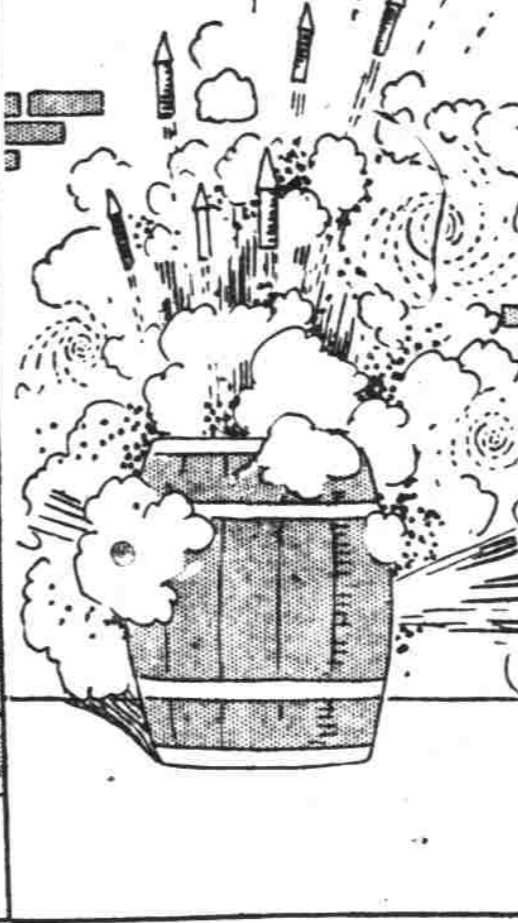

DENVER MAY SEE FRED WELSH AND AD WOLGAST BOX

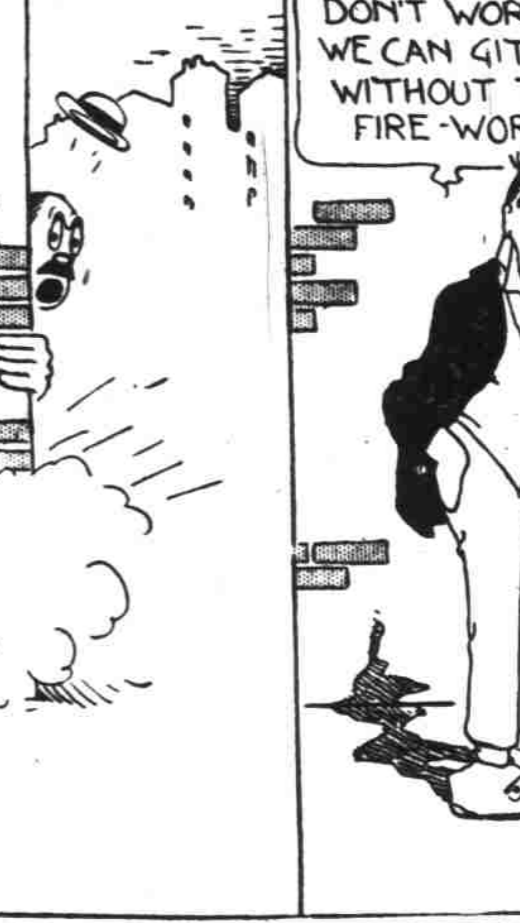
Champion Is Offered \$9000 for His End for Bout in Month of May.

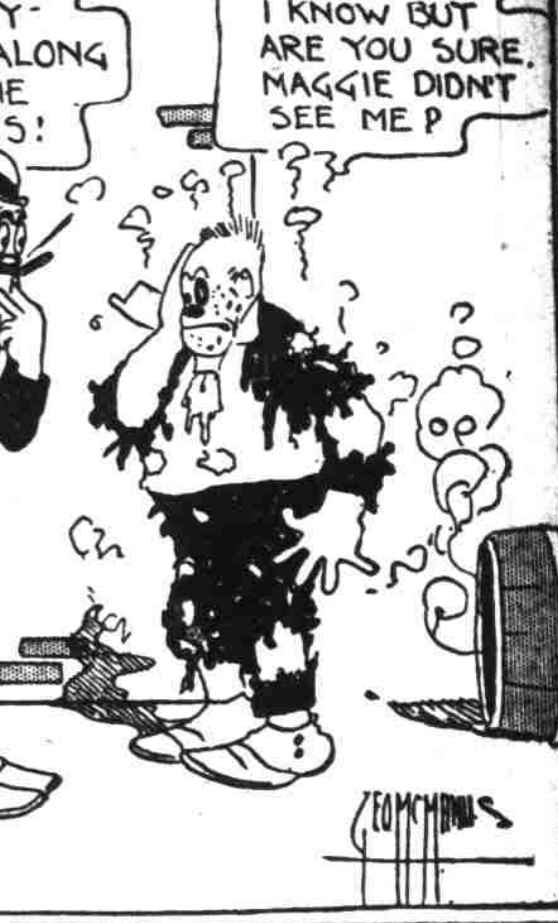
