

ARMY BILL IS CALLED HIGHLY CONSTRUCTIVE BY OREGON SENATOR

Chamberlain Believes Passage of Measure as Agreed Upon Is Now Assured.

EARLY ACTION EXPECTED

In Present Status, He Says, It Includes All Essential Points of Original Bill Proposed in Senate.

Washington, May 16.—(I. N. S.)—I think the army reorganization bill the most constructive piece of military legislation ever submitted to congress.

There seems to be a misunderstanding about the "senates" agreement. All in all, the bill as it now stands is a splendid measure.

The senate originally proposed a minimum of 178,000 combatants, and the conferees gave 175,000.

As finally accepted, though, the bill included the house provisions and added to them what Senator Lodge proposed.

The conferees' measure also provides the utilization of the schools for training and officers' reserve corps.

Thus the senate will hardly refuse to pass a measure that includes all the essential points of the original senate bill.
