Hayes and Lund of the St. Helens team have been suspended by Manager Ballagh.

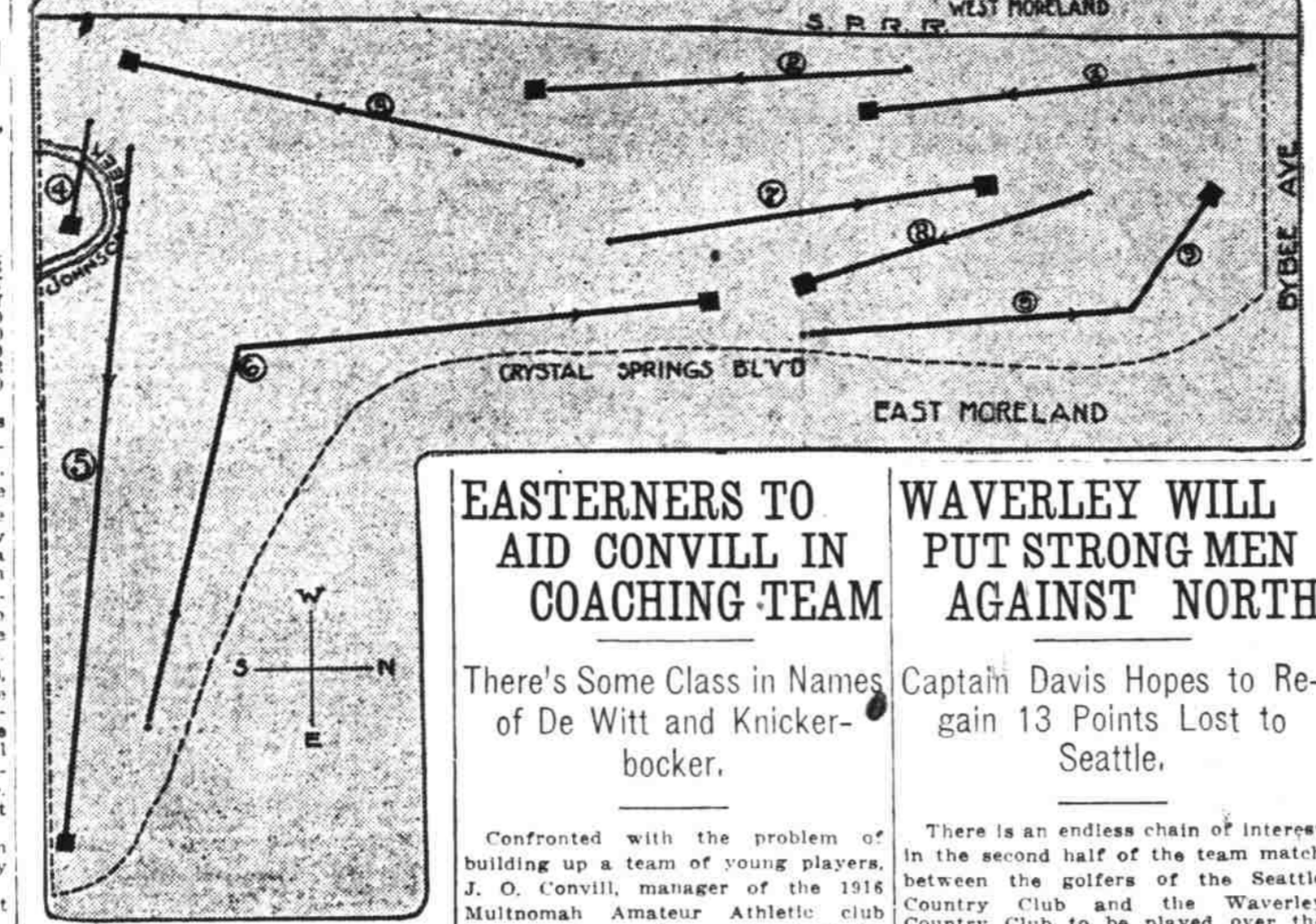
