After the Jeffries-Johnson fiasco in Reno, the number of rounds in San Francisco was reduced from 20 to 10. Afterwards it was raised to 20 rounds in San Francisco, and these were limited by the supervisors to one a month. Then the game was knocked in the head entirely, except for the four-round game.
