It will not receive any commercial or demand deposits in the ordinary business use of the term. It will be operated under the state laws, it is said, and will be a state institution. It will aim to supply the local need for an institution that will have funds which can make loans direct on first mor gages on real property in the city and county.

The bank will pay 3 per cent in July 1.


