Letter Is Circulated to Correct Alleged Misleading Rumors Pertaining to Travelers Across Border.

W. D. Scott, superintendent of Immigration for the Dominion of Canada, has sent out information to counteract, if possible, misleading rumors to the effect that Canada does not welcome newcomers while the war in Europe is raging.

"All United States citizens who by birth of naturalization are accord the same treatment. Persons in Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria or Turkey and who still remain zens of one or other of these count should not visit Canada at this time."

"Passports are entirely unnecessary they have never been called for in past, are not now, and are not to be so far as travel between United States and Canada is concerned."

"Persons born in one or other of the countries named but who have naturalized in the United States visit Canada if they so desire but should carry their United States naturalization papers as a means of identification. Persons who are no citizens or friendly or no countries may visit Canada with same freedom accorded to United States citizens."

"Conscription does not exist in Canada and is not contemplated, although it has been much talked of in United States especially by certain interests unfavorable to Canada. No need, therefore, misgiving through fear of conscription."
