Washington, June 5 .- (WASHING-TON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL) -Bids for the construction of the Portland postoffice for which \$550,000 has been appropriated will be received June 8. Blds will be opened August 7.

The total cost of the new postoffice will be about \$1,000,000," said Postmaster Frank S. Myers this morning. "The \$550,000 which has been appropriated is for the fiscal year and another appropriation will be made in time to finish the structure. It is to be expected that the actual work of construction will begin September and the postoffice should be completed and sendy for use a year and a half from that date."


