### SIGNING OF HARBORS MEASURE TO MEAN A CONTINUANCE OF PLAN

Bill Including Columbia River Projects Is Now Before President Wilson.

Press reports that the rivers and harbors bill was sent to President Wilson yesterday for signature bring to mind the provisions made in the bill for Oregon's two engineering projects.

The appropriations for the First district are: Coos bay, harbor maintenance and improvement, \$70,000; Tillamook bay and bar, and channel Bay City to Tillamook City, \$5000; Coquille river, maintenance, \$6000; Coos river, maintenance, \$3000; Siuslaw river, maintenance, \$5000; Snake river to Pittsburg Landing, Idaho, \$25,000; Columbia river above Celilo Falls, \$38,000.

The second district amounts are: Willamette and Yamhill rivers, \$47,000; Columbia and lower Willamette river below Vancouver, Wash., improvement and maintenance, \$350,000; mouth of the Columbia, \$1,200,000; Clatskanie river, \$1000; Clowitz and Lewis rivers, \$17,500; mouth of Cowitz, \$500.
