MAIER THROWN OUT OF COAST'S GOVERNING SET

Owner of Vernon Club Expelled After Refusing to Attend Meeting.

Los Angeles, July 14.—(P. N. S.)—Ed R. Maier, president of the Vernon baseball club, was expelled from the Pacific Coast league board of directors last night at a meeting of the board at the Van Nuys hotel. The directors of the league fired this bolt from the blue after a session that lasted a greater part of the day. This action was taken when Mr. Maier refused to come to the meeting and explain certain alleged questionable handling of players under suspension and players that had been released.

Just what action the Vernon baseball club will take is not known. It is certain that T. J. Darmody will become Maier's successor as director of the club. Rumors of strife in the league circles have been in the air for some time and the action taken by the directors today was a culmination of many things that have transpired since the present session opened. This is the first time on record that the Pacific Coast league board of directors' expulsion will not affect Maier's ownership of the Vernon club.
