

ARTILLERY BOYS ARE MAKING GOOD SCORES IN TARGET PRACTICE

Oregon Militiamen Are Getting Used to Handling Big Guns at Fort Stevens.

Astoria, Or., July 21.—Sub-caliber practice with the 10 inch coast defense guns at Fort Stevens is now under way.

The Oregon coast artillery troops camped here are making a splendid showing at that work, which is being held for the purpose of getting used to the big guns preparatory to service practice, which takes place on Tuesday and Wednesday next.

In sub-caliber practice, a sub-caliber tube which in reality is a gun of lesser calibre than the big gun, is inserted into the bore of the 10 inch cannon that guard the mouth of the Columbia river.

Targets are fired by tug. This enables the gun sections of the various companies manning the batteries to become well drilled in sighting and determining ranges and in handling the big guns generally, while the observing details and range sections, the men of which furnish data on which the guns are fired, are also given a chance to practice the many duties that fall to them.

During sub-caliber practice, as in service practice, the guns are fired at a target towed by a tug. The sub-caliber practice is being held at batteries Walker and Lewis facing the Columbia river. The target for the sub-caliber practice is being towed in the river by the steamer Major Guy Howard and the short ranges are being used. Several of the gun companies are making exceptionally good scores, while the work of all companies is above average.

Companies Keen for Honors. From present indications the service practice next week is going to be highly exciting, keen rivalry existing among the various companies for first honors with the huge service projectiles.
