FREDDIE WELSH GIVEN DECISION OVER LEONARD

Champion Forces Most of the Fighting, Making Strong Finish.

Brooklyn, July 29.—(U. P.)—Freddie Welsh, the world's lightweight champion, convinced 14,000 fans who jammed Washington park last night, that he knows how to fight. The champion met his recent conqueror, Benny Leonard, in a 10-round bout and outpointed him as decisively as Leonard handed it to him a few months ago. The champion was there with everything that a fighter needed and except for two or three rounds forced the fighting all the way. His speed, his marvelous foot work and his wonderful endurance were three characteristics that Leonard could not overcome.

Leonard Fought a Corking Fight

but it was a far different Welsh which Benny met last night. The champion showed that he was at his best. He entered the ring at 135 1/2 pounds. In the early part of rather the third and fifth rounds, the Leonard adherents were in their glory. In these two sessions Leonard brought into play a right hand body blow that bothered Welsh more than a little. After the fifth Welsh stepped along at a pace that proved too dazzling for his ambitious rival. Being out-buffed by the champion, Leonard, for there is hardly any other lightweight in the game that could have performed as well as Benny did with the men left the ring the vast throng stood up and gave Welsh a rousing reception.
