Chicago, Aug. 9 .- (I. N. S )-Not for years has there been such a sensational grain mar ket as that witnessed in the pit at the open-December Sc and May 7%c. Traders were wild. The market was literally swamped with buying orders and naturally the immediate effeet was a reactionary tendency. The market had been well cleared of short orders when the first figures were posted. The report. as analyzed here, provides hardly enough grain for domestic consumption. Where, then, traders ask, is Europe to get her grain? Foreign crops show an unquestionable short-age and Canadian grains are classed in the "northwest" damage.
