

AUGUST IS MONTH OF RING DESUETUDE FOR EASTERN FIGHT FANS

Hot Weather and Absence of
Moneyed Men at Beaches
Makes Sport Dull.

WELSH RISKS TITLE SOON

Lightweight Champion and Charley
White Will Box Twenty Rounds at
Colorado Springs Labor Day.

New York, Aug. 12.—This is the month of inactivity for the boxing fan. In four more weeks, however, the sport will thrive once again. But the expected activity will be but a circumstance to the condition that will exist if one event transpires before the busy season sets in.

Said event would be the dethroning of Freddy Welsh as lightweight champion of this war-plagued universe. And it is not unlikely that we will pay homage to a new champion in another month. For Welsh has been trapped into risking his coveted title on Colorado way on Labor day.

May Be Last Appearance.
Charley White, Chicago's noted wall-popper, is to be Welsh's opponent on this occasion. And it may be Welsh's last appearance as a ring gladiator. For a decisive defeat would end his inglorious reign as champion.

We say "decisive defeat" advisedly. White must score a decisive victory in order to gain the favor of the referee, Billy Rose, not that Rose has any personal dislike for White, but because Rose is in the way of Freddy Welsh. Billy has been Welsh's portable referee since Freddy won the title from Willie Ritchie on July 7, 1914.

Roeke Is His Referee.
Rose has referred for Welsh in New York, in Boston, in Canada—in fact in pretty nearly every town he has fought the last two years.

It was only on condition that Rose be the referee that Welsh finally acquiesced. In the September 1 date White will have to knock out Welsh in order to lift the title. Or the Chicagoan will have to trounce the Briton so severely that Rose will be apprehensive of robbing White of his title won honors. A slight margin at the end of the 20 rounds will get White nothing better than a draw. Rose assured of that, and White noting the popular verdict favored White twice and Welsh once.

Twice during these bouts, White had laid Welsh on a knockout. In the first round of their Milwaukee bout, White stunned Welsh with the very first punch, and Frederick was wobbly for the rest of the fight. White, however, lacked sufficient finishing power or the knowledge to finish a befuddled champion, and through the kindness of a lifetime slip through the fingers of the referee.

Generally Saved Him.
At Brighton Beach, a year ago, White had Welsh in dire straits in the seventh round. But again Welsh's generalship saved him. White instead of standing off and measuring the tottering champion, rushed headlong into Welsh, flailing both hands at random. This afforded Welsh the chance to clinch, until his probable loss was cleared. Once again, White passed up a glittering opportunity.

Charley guarantees to do better next time. The Chicagoan realizes it will be his final chance at the crown while Welsh is champion and if he ever has Freddy in his clutches on Labor day, White is going in for a knockout, or he knows it himself in the attempt.

Has Everything to Gain.
White has everything to gain and nothing to lose in this bout. A victory—if he can convince Rose he is the winner—will mean a title and attendant big money and glory. A defeat, and White's status among the lightweights will be just what it is today.

White is undoubtedly the hardest hitting lightweight in the game today. His record bears out this statement. For a while, up to less than a month ago, it was feared that White's wall-popper had become rusty and that he could not deliver with the effective snap of old, but Charley dispelled all these doubts when he knocked out Mat Welsh, the former English champion, in five rounds. Welsh was floored three in the fourth round and was sagging to the floor in the fifth when his manager threw a sponge into the ring in acknowledgment of defeat.

Has Not Been Floored.
Welsh had never been floored and with an alien referee, in the ring Freddy feared a job. Had Billy Rose been present, the bout would have gone through as per schedule, despite the sparse assemblage of spectators.

This time Welsh will have his own referee, so it is up to White to dispense with the judgment of a biased arbiter by flattening Welsh with a good old left hook to the chin. A finishing body blow would afford Welsh the chance to claim a foul and get away with it. Now, don't forget, Billy Rose is to referee.

Wants to Swim Channel.
Charles B. Danbarrow, the Philadelphia bank clerk distance swimmer, is ambitious to swim the English channel. Only two swimmers have accomplished the feat. In 1875 Captain M. S. Webb, after 16 attempts, swam from Dover, England, to Cape Gris Nez, France, in 22 hours and 35 minutes, while in 1911 William T. Burgess swam from Dover to Calais, France, in 21 hours and 45 minutes on his second attempt.

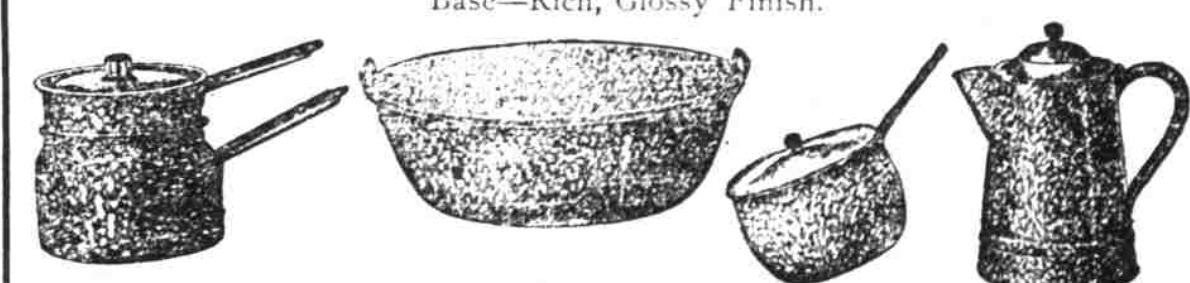
