

MATERNITY HOSPITAL BUILDING PLANS ARE NOW BEING RUSHED

Wemme Institution Is to Be Ready for Occupancy in Four Months, It Is Said.

ENDOWMENT IS AMPLE

No Charge Will Be Made for Services and No Discrimination Will Be Shown to Inmates.

Plans are being rushed by A. E. Doyle, architect, while the four-acre tract at Blythehood is being surveyed and cleared preparatory to the start of construction on the White Shield maternity hospital for wayward girls.

After months of searching for a suitable site, the board of directors recently bought the four-acre hillside tract at the head of Thurman street, on which the two-story hospital will be erected.

The grounds will be sufficiently cleared of brush and trees to allow room for the work of a landscape artist, but the natural environment will be preserved as much as possible.

The hospital will be maintained free of charge, without discrimination as to race or creed, from the income of half of the estate of the late Dr. Henry Wemme, appraised at \$350,000, left for that purpose.

The board of directors, for many years associates and friends of the donor, will have full authority in the disposal of the institution for three years, after which period the hospital will be turned over to the Christian Reformed church in the form of a trust.

With that portion of the estate intended to the directors to utilize the income of three pieces of property for the proposed institute.

Within the next few months prominent physicians are expected to serve on a board of directors of the medical side of the institute.

The will of Dr. Henry Wemme also provided that the directors were to mount a fund, built at a cost of \$250,000, which Mr. Wemme intended to hard-surface in time, should go to George Joseph, his attorney. Knowing that Mr. Wemme had offered it to the United States government free, provided that it should be maintained in good shape, Mr. Joseph has recently made a similar offer to the government.

ALLEGED BAD CHECK ARTIST IS REPORTED ARRESTED IN EL PASO

M. Grabfelder, Thiel Detective Agency Charges, Passed Two Worthless Checks Here

M. Grabfelder is under arrest at El Paso, Texas, according to telegraphic advices received from the El Paso office of the Thiel Detective Agency by F. B. Sutton, local manager, last night.

Sutton charges that Grabfelder, under aliases of Goldblatt, Lindy, Gordon and Gelsenburg, represented himself as a traveling salesman. He worked at the hotels, traveling and dressing well, and always carrying checks for \$100 or more.

He arrived at the Benson hotel on August 2, Sutton charges, and registered under the name of Grabfelder. He cashed a check on August 3 for \$100 on the blank of the Chicago Mop and Polished Goods Co., Chicago.

Two days later, Sutton charges, he returned and registered at the Porterville hotel, El Paso, Texas, cashing a check for \$100 there, leaving the same day for El Paso. He was traced by his baggage and the amount of the check.

Grabfelder cashed checks at the City Tailors of Chicago as well as the Chicago Mop & Polish company, and is wanted by the U. S. Grant hotel in San Diego, California, hotel in Los Angeles and the Sacramento hotel in Sacramento, Sutton asserts.

Clark Also Wanted in Kansas City

State Parole Officer Keller Receives Word That Man Who Broke Oregon Prison Had Trouble in East.

Salem, Or., Aug. 15.—State Parole Officer Keller received word from the metropolitan police of Kansas City, Mo., today that E. J. Clark, an inmate of the Oregon prison, was convicted of grand larceny in April, 1915, and sentenced to the bench, after being sentenced to serve two years in the penitentiary.

Efforts have been recently made to secure a pardon for Clark. He was released several days ago in Spokane and returned to the Oregon prison to serve out a sentence for obtaining money under false pretenses. He escaped after being made a trustee at the institution here, and nothing was heard from him until he was caught in Spokane.
