SKILLED MEN ARE IN DEMAND NOW AT MANY SHIP YARDS

Plants Along Columbia River Are Busy Turning Out Vessels These Days.

Contracts Are Waiting Demand for Wooden Ships Remains as Strong as It Was Two Months Ago, Say the Builders.

Skilled labor is in great demand in the many shipyards now building wooden or steel vessels along the Columbia river.

Close to 500 men will be needed for the Columbia Engineering Works, Standifer-Clarkson and Heath plants, which are expected to be in operation within 30 days.

The Northwest Steel company is now using 300 men, and expects to have 800 on the payroll within six weeks.
