Australians would then welcome Gibbons with open arms, even though he had conquered the great Jack Dillon. The antipodens are dubious as to how Darcy would fare against Dillon, but they are convinced that Gibbons would be a mark for their idol.

While Gibbons would be basking in all this idolatry (assuming, of course, that he decisively defeated Dillon) a little English lad would be pining his heart away. For the little English lad only recently handed Michael a tasty pasting; and the feat already has almost been forgotten. Ted-Kid Lewis is the little English boy who is willing to show that he can do it all over again. But wafy Mike is carefully avoiding a recurrence of such a catastrophe.
