MIKE GIBBONS WILL BATTLE DILLON, AND THEN IT'S AUSTRALIA

Clean Victory Over Giant Killer Would Mean Much to St. Paul Ghost.

ANTIPODEANS WOULD SEE

They Are Dubious About Darcy Beating Dillon, But They Think Gibbons Made to Order for Idol.

New York, Sept. 9.—Michael Gibbons, after a pause following his previous bout with Dillon, is ready to return to the ring. Mike's first opponent upon his re-entry will be no less a ring personage than Jack Dillon. It will be a match between the best middleweight in the world and the foremost lightweight on the globe. Early October is designated for festivities, and a merry brooklet is expected to be.

Gibbons' purpose is tackling such a formidable customer as Dillon upon his renewal of ring acquaintances in two-fold. Mike has long been accused of picking his opponents, and has often been charged as lacking fighting instinct—in other words, that Mike showed a taste of saffron wherever the going got too heavy. It is to disprove both of these old declared statements that Gibbons is jeopardizing his pugilistic future.

They Take an Awful Chance.

Any man who jeopardizes his pugilistic future—and his life. Thus far every one of Dillon's foes has escaped with his life; but, oh, the many promising careers he has ruined. Gibbons insists he was—and still is—of the same mind when he consented to spar off with the Indianapolis man-killer. He was of such a mind that he made Dillon agree to make weight for the fight, to be fought at 12 o'clock on the afternoon of the battle. Pigmey Jack will have to be trained quite fine to attain this poundage—his best weight is about 135 pounds at the ringside. Ask Tom Cowler and Frank Moran.

As Gibbons has taken into himself a manager—no, not a wife (the already has a family), but a manager in ring matters—who may expect to see Michael in action more often than heretofore. The first stroke of Mike's new mentor was to arrange the Dillon match, said manager, "colored that Mike must do more fighting—and more efficient fighting—to hold his grip on the public, and to resuscitate his waning popularity."

Gibbons Has Some Foresight.

Mike is foresighted enough to visualize the momentary worth of a point victory over Dillon. Should the bout eventuate in Mike's favor it would enhance his drawing capabilities to the nth power. He would be looked upon as a real champion, and, by the heavyweights, as a savior of their blighted careers. Australians would then welcome Gibbons with open arms, even though he had conquered the great Jack Dillon. The antipodeans are dubious as to how Darcy would fare against Dillon, but they are convinced that Gibbons would be a mark for their idol.

While Gibbons were basking in all this idolatry, of course, that he decisively defeated Dillon, a little English lad would be pling his heart away. For the little English lad only recently handled Michael in a tasty meeting; and the feat is ready to be almost forgotten. Ted-Kid Lewis is the little English boy who is willing to show that he can do it all over again. But Lewis' favor is being avoided, a recurrence of such a catastrophe. He simply refuses to have anything more to do with the little English lad.

Lewis, who has been spending the summer in South America—not by choice, but by compulsion, as he must live up to an ill advised contract—will return to these shores shortly and start anew his campaign among the lightweight, welterweights, middleweights and light heavyweights. Lewis has already fought in the first three classes, and is prepared for the plunge in the domain of Jack Dillon and Battling Lavinsky.

He Wants Big Game Now.

Lewis is not seeking matches "with his mediocre" class. Jack Dillon is the one he desires mostly to engage in mortal combat. It may sound ridiculous for a legitimate 135 pounder to ever dream of fighting Dillon. But, remember, Lewis was also ridiculed when he suggested a bout with Gibbons. Yet Ted-Kid went out and polished off the crafty Michael in 10 rapid rounds.
