

WOMEN ADVOCATES REVIEW MEETING AT SHADOW LAWN, N. J.

Mrs. Alexander Thompson Tells of Personal Talk With President on Issues.

HARMONY IS EVIDENCED

Dr. Esther Pohl Lovejoy Recalls Orations Received by President; Women's Democratic Club Meets.

Mrs. Alexander Thompson of the Dallas was the principal speaker at the meeting of the Women's Democratic club held in Central library hall last night.

Mrs. Thompson, who spoke to a packed house, told of her experiences at the notification ceremonies at Shadow Lawn, which she attended as the proxy of H. M. Estery, national committeewoman from Oregon.

President Is Interviewed.

During her visit to Shadow Lawn Mrs. Thompson was accorded a personal interview with the president during which she discussed Oregon political conditions with him, telling of the prominent part taken in this state by the women, and of the many offices held by women, and the good records made by them in official life.

Buried Clause Discussed.

Dr. Lovejoy called the attention of the convention to the buried clause, with the result that it was attacked from all sides, Dr. Anna Shaw, the venerable leader of the suffrage cause, taking the forefront in the battle against it.

Dr. Lovejoy also told of the visit made by President Wilson to the convention and of his address before it, he being the first president who has ever gone out of Washington to speak before the association.

The following night was Hughes' night, Dr. Lovejoy said, but Mr. Hughes was not present, having sent Raymond Robinson and Ernest Parsons, of New York, to represent him.

Mr. Parsons spoke for Mr. Hughes, and began his address by saying that he intended to make a political speech, that he was a politician, a Republican politician, and a suffragist.

Mrs. Carl Lorenz, struck by a motor truck driven by a Chinese boy, at Third and Morrison streets, August 13, died last night at St. Vincent's hospital as a result of her injuries.

KANSAS MOB FORCES JAIL, HANGS NEGRO TO A TELEGRAPH POLE

Olathe, Kans., Prisoner Was Convicted of Murdering a Farmer, Given 99 Years.

Olathe, Kans., Sept. 21.—(I. N. S.)—Bert Dudley, a prisoner in the Jackson county jail awaiting removal to the state penitentiary to begin a 99-year sentence for murder, was removed from his cell at 2 o'clock this morning by a mob of about 50 masked and armed men and hanged to a telegraph pole on the outskirts of the town.

The mob broke down the doors of the jail to get at the prisoner and overpowered Sheriff Carroll, after the latter had given the keys to his wife, who fled and refused the offered admittance. Dudley, resigned to his fate, but cursing, was coolly dressed as the door of his cell was smashed open.

Dudley, who was convicted last Tuesday, murdered a farmer named Muller, by whom he was employed, after an altercation over the farm work and later murdered Muller's wife when she inquired concerning Muller's whereabouts. Dudley hid the bodies in a well and they were not discovered for more than a week.

HUGHES POUNDS HARD ON AMERICANISM IN MILWAUKEE ADDRESS

Crowd Accepts Remarks as a Pledge to Bring England to Account If Elected.

HEARTY CHEERS GIVEN

Statements Constructed as Answer to Newspaper Demand to Know His Views on Hyphenated Question.

By William Hooster. Milwaukee, Sept. 21.—(I. N. S.)—Eight thousand people last night cheered for two minutes Charles E. Hughes' demand for the protection of American commerce.

"We stand for the principle of sound Americanism," he said. "We have no secret purpose. We have no intrigues. We have no covert understanding. We stand for American rights with respect to American lives, American property and American commerce."

Talk Considered Anti-English. Accepting this as a renewed pledge from Hughes, of an intention to bring England to account if elected to the presidency, the big audience in the auditorium, where the day's tour of Wisconsin was brought to an end, rose in their seats and gave the candidate the heartiest cheer of the day.
